## Industrial Skin Care

Your skin protects your body from enemies outside, such as dirt and infectious germs. It also insulates the body from cold and heat.

Healthy skin has a system of maintaining itself, replacing old cells with new ones and releasing oils to keep the skin pliable and resistant to damage.

But sometimes the onslaught from the outside can be too severe and the skin cannot bring itself back into a strong, healthy condition.

This is what happens when the skin is over-exposed to chemicals, moisture, abrasives and other substances.

Industrial dermatitis is the name for this inflamed condition of the skin. It starts with irritation and redness, swelling and blisters may also appear and infection may set in. The hands and arms are most commonly affected, but dermatitis can occur anywhere the skin has been contacted by irritating substances.

Dermatitis can be mild, only affecting the top layer of skin. Or it can extend to the deepest skin layers.

If the skin tries to heal, it becomes thick and permanently disfigured. Damaged skin can also allow the entry of toxic chemicals which poison internal organs or eventually cause cancer.

**PM 2:** With regard to safety, it was another good week on the PM2 line. Clean-up continued after the 4-day shutdown to get the building in a more acceptable state.

It was a very efficient week at 90.2% total efficiency and there was only one Operations-related break all week!

Certainly this indicates the machine had been cleaned especially well in the past couple of weeks. We did have a pulp shortage shutdown of 4 hours on Friday after TMP suffered through some power bumps due to lightning strikes. This shutdown occurred during the seemingly successful light basis-weight offset run.

Pressroom feedback is the final assessment. For these light basis-weight runs it is necessary to slow back the TMP screen room production rate to maintain suitable freeness for optimal paper quality and it should be noted that this contributed to our downtime on Friday. The starch trial with Cargill ran smoothly and the paper tests show no problem so far – testing will continue.
