New

- → Andrew is also working on a way for patrons to apply online for a library card. They would show their ID and receive a library card when they come in.
- → We received \$8,429 from the North Net Library System. This money is to be used to defray the cost of connecting to the CENIC internet system. Information and invoice attached.
- → We received a \$1,000 grant from Penguin Random House. The original grant was for \$2,500. They awarded us \$1,000 with no rules for spending the money. We would like to purchase DVDs with this money. We rely solely on donations from our patrons for DVDs.
- → Our children's programs have returned! Our first storytime was with Dr. Grins the puppet he and his assistant read a book to the child that attended and the books were donated to the library as well as toothbrushes.
- → We have received supplies for the Summer Reading Program
- → Lego club will be returning soon. We are seeking donations of female characters.
 We have plenty of males for boys but not many girl characters.
- → Internet Connectivity flyers attached Affordable Fast internet for all families. I took flyers to the school district, charter schools, Department of Social Services and the newspaper. www.internetforallnow.org Call 866-696-8748.

Grants

- → Applied for the Humboldt Area Foundation grant
- → Applied for the Coast Central Credit Union grant
- → Applied for the ByWater Solutions grant
- → Applied for lunch at the library grant. If awarded I will personally go to Gasquet, Hiouchi, Smith River and the Wednesday Farmer market and hand out books to children who are there to receive free lunches.
- → Application in process for the Building Forward Grant property procurement funds are not available with this grant. All of the properties that have been presented are double or more the cost of our building fund.

Other

- → Broken Window was replaced by Crescent City Glass
- → Loose drain pipe by the front door was repaired by Stone Roofing
- → Public Health has given us masks, gloves, face shields and hand sanitizer

- → Signs posted on the door and in the library reminding patrons that the library is a safe space for children and families. We have been having issues with patrons coming in under the influence, with a lit joint, aggressive dogs, and foul smelling dogs that leave behind offensive odors. Also the homeless are camping on our front and back steps and leaving trash, cigarette butts and personal belongings strewn around the area. Our staff and patrons do not feel safe leaving the building at times because of the homeless. Several patrons have left comments on our Facebook page that they do not feel comfortable in our library.
- → The cost of tuition and fees for the director to obtain the required 4 year degree have been covered by financial aid. I am on track to graduate in May of 2023 with a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from Cal Poly Humboldt formerly HSU.

Hi Phyllis,

CENIC's "Year 8" circuit RFP recently wrapped up and I have attached a copy of the winning bids to connect Del Norte County Library District to CENIC's CalREN statewide fiber-optic network.

Please take a few moments to review the attached quote PDF and let me know if you have any questions about it. If you would like to schedule a Zoom conference call to walk through the quote this week, please let me know and I can set that up at your convenience.

If there are no questions, simply send an email to broadband@califa.org by March 8 informing the project team of your intent to (A) proceed with the quoted 1Gbps Frontier circuit or the 10Gbps Spectrum circuit, or (B) decline to proceed with either circuit quote at this time (and we can follow-up again in the autumn for the next recruiting cycle covering FY 23-24).

Please understand that this March deadline is just so that CENIC can file reimbursement paperwork appropriately for the upcoming E-rate fiscal year. Indicating your intent to proceed with connectivity at this time <u>will not</u> obligate you to anything; you can later decide not to proceed (prior to signing a contract) if your situation changes.

There's two quotes in the PDF:

- Pages 1-3: a 1Gbps circuit via Frontier at \$1400/mo, with a monthly \$150 "cross connect" fee
- Pages 4-5: a 10Gbps circuit via Spectrum at \$1252/mo, with a monthly \$350 "cross connect" fee

FYI -- Gbps = gigabits per second

Please know that the \$6k "circuit deployment fee" Non-Recurring Cost listed in both quotes would be covered by the State Library using funds provided by the State Legislature (per a note on p.2 of the quote PDF) and that the other Non-Recurring Costs on both of the quotes would be eligible for funding assistance via the State Library's broadband grant.

The other Non-Recurring Costs (i.e., \$300 for the 1Gbps circuit and \$1250 for the 10Gbps circuit) would be eligible for assistance via the State Library's broadband grant.

With the Non-Recurring Costs covered by other sources of funding, the annual costs would look like the following:

1Gbps Frontier circuit:

- Annual, undiscounted cost: \$18,600 (i.e., cost before E-rate/CTF factored in)
- Discounted annual cost: \$2,640 (i.e., effective cost after E-Rate/CTF factored in)

10Gbps Spectrum circuit:

- Annual, undiscounted cost: \$19,224 (i.e., cost before E-rate/CTF factored in)
- Discounted annual cost: \$4,951.20 (i.e., effective cost after E-Rate/CTF factored in)

Note that it can take between 12-18 months for E-rate reimbursements to become available, so you would want to budget for the Annual, undiscounted cost at first. That said, if that annual undiscounted amount is a barrier to Del Norte joining the project, you can apply for "hardship" funding via the State Library's broadband grant to cover the first 12 months of undiscounted circuit costs (i.e., \$1,400/mo for 1Gbps or \$1,252/mo for 10Gbps).

Reason for Request

Line 414-70-20230 Professional Services is in the negative balance of \$491.85. We would like to transfer funds from lines 414-70-91124 Gifts unspecified in the amount of \$1,130 and line 414-70-91124 002 Gifts specified in the amount of \$2,000 to cover the negative amount and to cover future charges on this line. \$925 is billed monthly for janitorial services and the transfer amount will cover 3 months of janitorial services. We cannot wait till next budget year to transfer funds because this is an active line and it is in the negative amount currently and we cannot continue to bill services to this line.

Updated Contract between Ross Janitorial and the Del Norte County Library

First, all of us at Ross Janitorial would like to thank you for using our services. We have been working with the Del Norte County Library now for over 6 years to provide its patrons and employees with a clean comfortable environment to be in. As a local born and raised here I spent time at the library as a child, and we love to support local educational facilities like this. Unfortunately, as times change, so must contracts and pricing. Inflation and the difficulty in finding qualified employees force us to increase our service rates. Another factor in this is the location and frequency of homeless people harassing some of our employees outside your facility. We have nothing against them in general, but I can only have certain employees clean because entering and leaving your building at night is dangerous and frightening to some of our workers. This is a proposed new price update starting in April of 2022. In summary, it is a price increase of \$200.00 per month, for a total janitorial cost of \$1125 per month. I understand that economic struggles affect our customers too, so if this doesn't work or we need to adjust some things please communicate with me and we can try to come to an agreement.

Thank you again for working with us and for all the work you do for our local community.

The cleaning services will be performed after closing hours and before opening time 6 times per week. The services Monday through Friday will be the same, and on Saturday there are a few extra things performed as listed below. Ross Janitorial will have the necessary keys and alarm codes. Ross Janitorial will provide the cleaning products and vacuum. The Del Norte County library will supply the trash bags and paper products through Mendes supply or equivalent. Ross Janitorial holds 2 million dollars in liability insurance, a Crescent City business license, and a California department of labor janitorial license. Ross Janitorial will provide an invoice for our services around the end of each month with a net 30 timeframe for payment. If services need to be changed or canceled 30 days' notice is required unless otherwise agreed upon.

Employee Area-

Disinfect touchpoints like light switches, door handles, phones, desks, etc.

Dust computer screens, countertops, desk surfaces.

Empty trash cans in the office area and kitchen area.

Sweep and mop the hard surface floor, vacuum floor mats, and carpet.

Restock paper towels and any other requested items.

Patron Area-

Disinfect touch surfaces including door handles, countertops, tables, computer mouse, etc.

Empty trash cans.

Vacuum high traffic area from the front door through the center of the building and around the computer desks.

Sweep and mop hard floor entrance area.

Restrooms-

Disinfect, clean, and wipe down door handles, light switches, sinks, toilets, dispensers.

Refill paper towels, toilet paper, and soap supply.

Empty trash cans and replace bags.

Sweep and mop hard floors with a disinfecting solution.

Vacuum the entire public space.
Clean entrance door glass.
Dust and disinfect desks in kids' area and outer wall area.
Annual or as needed extra work included:
Scrub and buff VCT floor in the employee area. This does not include floor stripping which is generally needed every 3-5 years in this environment.
