## **Transcript of Land Description**

[Isabel Swift to Jean Swift Phinney]

Phinney Land in 1988: Beginning at the most westerly corner, in the highway leading from Westmore to Willoughby Station (formerly South Barton) of the land belonging to the late Arthur L. Swift. Thence down the old road leading in former years to the Pillsbury 'Mill" South 66 degrees East, 250 feet to a whole birch tree, marked. Thence southwesterly following the old road, 180 feet to an iron stake at the northwest corner of land belonging to one Anne S. Tanner [formerly belonging to Emerson H. Swift -- added]; Thence along said Tanner line as follows: due east a distance of 135.5 feet to an iron pipe in the junction of two cottage roads; thence S 87 degrees 56' E 199.33 feet to an iron pin set in the ground; thence N 46 degrees 14' E 78.05 feet to an iron pipe and thence beyond the shore of Willoughby Lake; thence northerly along the westerly shore of said lake 76 feet to an iron in a boulder; thence continuing northerly along the sand beach 169 feet to an iron stake; thence N 79 degrees W 320 feet to a cedar stake at the edge of the woods; thence S 86 degrees W 400 feet to the point of beginning.
