The Original Back Border, FESW, passed through the gap between the two boulders above on a bearing of \$ 53 W described in both the 1947 Kent and Willis deeds. This is confirmed by the 2013 Horizons Survey for the bearing taken from Stake S which is 90' from the wooden stake as shown. The gap between the boulders is about 18 inches, or less. In the early 1970s Sherrill Kent affirmed the same location.

FESW was apparently surveyed by Emerson Swift as being the sum of the distances: 235' from F to E, 90' from E to S and about 50' from S to W equal to 375' [see <u>Corrected</u> 1947 Map II for the S to W value]. This data should be found in Swift's notebook.
