



## Directions



- Leave Parrett Trail Bikes onto Parrett cycleway. After 150 yards, turn left onto Huish Drove, over Black Bridge, until you reach a T-junction with "The Hill", turn right towards Muchelney.
- At the triangle, as you face St Peter and St Paul's Church, with Muchelney Abbey behind, bear left past The Priest's House, and then bear right on Law Lane towards Muchelney Ham.
- At the next fork, bear right towards School Farm Shop and Muchelney Pottery. Just before the Farm Shop turn left through the hamlet of Muchelney Ham, to join Wetmoor Lane. Turn right and continue along Wetmoor Lane.
- After half a mile, turn left into Church Lane and continue until you
  join the B3165 in the village of Long Load.
- Turn left into the village of Long Sutton. Opposite The Devonshire Arms, turn left onto Shute Lane, past the turning to Brook Farm Campsite and 2nd left at the triangle, in to Crouds Lane.
- Pass Harry's Cider farm on your left until you meet the A372 in Long Sutton. Turn left for a short distance, past Upton Bridge Farm Shop, to a small crossroads where you turn right unto Hermitage Road.
- Cycle through the small hamlet of Upton for approx. a mile until you meet the B3153. Turn left, and immediate right at The Halfway House, into Hermitage Hill towards the village of Pitney.
- Cycle through Pitney village on Hermitage Hill, and straight on up the hill to Stowey Road. At the small crossroads turn left onto Middlegate Road.
- Take the 2nd left, just before you reach Pitney Farm Shop, Café and Camping, and head down Church Hill into Pitney.
- At the crossroads turn right on to Gore Lane, past Pitney Village Hall, and into Culver Hill, heading towards the hamlet of Wearne.
- At the T-junction, turn left and immediate right into Wearne Lane, which you stay on until you leave Wearne, and drop down towards a mini roundabout in the approach to Langport.
- Take the last exit off the roundabout into Langport town centre, passing under the railway bridge, and in to the old market town.
   At the pedestrian crossing beside the clock tower, take a left into Cocklemoor Car Park.
- Follow the footpath alongside the river, over the new River Parrett footbridge and back to Parrett Trail Bikes.
