

JBA hosts Honorary Commander Induction Ceremony

Joint Base Andrews welcomed 10 community and civic leaders into the 2018 Honorary Commanders Program during an induction ceremony here.

"These relationships are mutually beneficial," said Col. Jocelyn J. Schermerhorn, 11th Wing and Joint Base Andrews vice commander. Across the National Capital Region, honorary commanders serve as a civilian interface between Joint Base Andrews and the external community, ensuring an increase in direct communication and partnership.
