## STATE MAIL-IN BALLOT ISSUES CORRECTED

**Uniontown, PA** – The Fayette County Election Bureau has addressed a recently discovered issue with mail-in ballots caused by the state's SURE software system.

New ballots are being issued for all voters affected by the software error.

In correcting this error, some voters may receive a second ballot. It is only necessary to complete and return one ballot to the Fayette County Election Bureau.

Only one ballot per voter will be counted for the Nov. 3 Presidential Election.

If you previously submitted an online application and have not received your ballot, you are able to visit the election bureau during office hours (8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) and vote in person the same day.

Additionally, the Fayette County Election Bureau will also open this Saturday, Oct. 24, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., in order to serve as many citizens as possible.

If you do not receive your mail-in ballot in a timely manner, please call the Fayette County Election Bureau at 724-430-1289 or email <a href="mailto:lblosser@fayettepa.org">lblosser@fayettepa.org</a>.

When contacted, the election bureau will electronically cancel the original ballot that was to be mailed to you and reissue a replacement ballot.

All mail-in ballots must be submitted by the state Supreme Court deadline.
