An overview

The Trust was a vision of Robert C. Hoffman, who was known for his commitment to supporting the needs of Adams County residents. Twice a year an advisory committee carries out his wishes by reviewing proposals submitted in January and July. This year there were 72 applicants in the two grant cycles. After careful deliberation 50 projects were selected for funding. \$310,000 was distributed to 46 nonprofits, continuing the legacy of Robert C. Hoffman, bettering individuals and communities. Gettysburg Community Concert Association

Beautiful music was brought to Adams County by the Gettysburg Community Concert Association. Performances by *Silver and Strings* and the *Adaskin Trio* were held at Gettysburg High School auditorium. With the help of a \$1,000 grant from Robert C. Hoffman Charitable Endowment Trust, a student outreach program was provided at no cost to students in Kindergarten through grade five at Conewago Township Elementary School. Students were invited to play the stringed instruments. They found the harp fascinating!

Gettysburg Community Soup Kitchen

The Gettysburg Community Soup Kitchen (GCSK) is open every day of the year to serve a nutritious mid day meal.

This program also helps those who may otherwise go hungry when unable to make their budget stretch. GCSK staff get to know their guests' individual circumstances, and provide 20- 30 \$15 vouchers each month so those who need basic foods can shop at Kennie's Market.

The Robert C. Hoffman Charitable Endowment Trust provided two \$2,000 grants this year, resulting in more than 270 food vouchers.

Big Brothers Big Sisters

Big Brothers Big Sisters creates matches for students in after-school programs in four Adams County elementary schools. With the help of a \$4,500 grant from RCHCET, 75 Gettysburg College students met once a week with the younger students and worked on homework, made crafts, studied extra materials such as Scholastic books, or played games. When the school year ended, matches continued their relationships through summer phone calls and electronic messaging. 65% of the matches continued into the next school year. forming meaningful bonds.

100% of the Littles advanced to the next grade level.

70% of Littles ended the program with age-appropriate literacy skills, as opposed to 53% at the program's start: an increase of 17%.





2017 Heritage Festival



The Interfaith Center For Peace and Justice and the YWCA joined forces to produce a unity festival where all would feel welcome and valued. The mission of the annual festival is to build appreciation of the cultures of Adams County through music (bands were funded in part by a \$1,500 RCHCET grant), ethnic cuisine, arts and heritage crafts, and children's activities. 35 nonprofits provided information about their organizations.

Community Media

Community Media has upgraded their technology and the appearance of the studio with assistance from a Robert C. Hoffman grant of \$5,000 for lighting equipment. The new equipment total wattage is less than half of the original lighting equipment at full power and provides more than twice the luminance. The energy savings and professional results help Community Media continue to inform the people of Adams County and beyond about the news, events, and activities happening in and around our community. Community Media has gone above and beyond in highlighting the services provided by nonprofits and giving them the positive exposure needed to generate additional community support for their good works.



Harrisburg Area Community College Foundation

\$5,000 was granted to the Emergency Assistance Fund for bedbug fumigation, and Adams County residents enrolled at HACC's Gettysburg Campus. This fund enables students to continue their education when financial emergencies arise, such as losing a job and being threatened with eviction for



failure to pay rent, car repairs, childcare expenses due to loss of the family caregiver. HACC staff monitored students who received an emergency grant. Awards averaged \$500 each. Nine of the 10 students who received an award remain enrolled, while one student graduated and is employed.

One student sent a thank you letter telling her life story. As a high school senior, she became homeless when her grandmother died. She couch hopped from friend to friend for a couple years, lived in a car for months, and eventually saved enough to get an apartment.

She had a child and completed her GED. Marriage, child rearing, and divorce followed. as she worked 3rd shift in a warehouse. Exhausted, she looked for a change and followed her immigrant grandparents' example of rejecting welfare and pursuing a college education. She has found HACC staff very supportive, and is thriving academically, but nearly had to drop out when high winter heating bills forced her to choose between registering for clinicals or paying the electric bill. This grant allowed her to continue toward her goal of a nursing career.

Muscular Dystrophy Association

The Muscular Dystrophy Association is a first time grantee, receiving \$2,000 so that Adams County children with MD can experience camp, and their families get a respite. MDA provides an unforgettably powerful experience that lasts far beyond one week at camp. As one mother wrote, "My daughter became more independent and looks forward to camp next year. Camp is the one place where I can leave her and have no fear that anything bad will happen to her. It's the one place she can go and be herself."
