## **Adams County Arts Council**

Sustaining The Arts Regionally is the purpose of STAR grants made by the Arts Council. A \$9,000 grant from the Hoffman Trust enabled the Arts Council to support arts residencies and events in the county's schools for 1,380 students.

## The Arc of Adams County

With a \$4,000 grant The Arc purchased technology to better serve people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and help the office run smoothly. Laptops are employed to help individuals fill out applications to find employment and affordable housing. The internet connects people with opportunities to live life to their fullest potential.

## **Gettysburg Area Recreation Authority**



Swope Field was so overdue for renovations, teams were unable to use it for competitive purposes. A grant of \$8,000 dramatically improved the field, installing new infield dirt which drains better and is a safer surface to slide on. It is primarily used for girls softball. The number of participants is expected to grow from the current 120 girls on four teams.





Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Arendtsville received a grant of \$12,000 to build a new ADA compliant unisex restroom and upgrade two existing restrooms. This new accessibility enables participation in public gatherings for a greater number of people.

## Adams County Children's Advocacy Center

The Children's Advocacy Center provides a safe, comfortable, neutral place for

identification, investigation, prosecution, and treatment of child abuse.

Due to the increasing number of children receiving services at the center, the kitchen area was pressed into service as a waiting area.

A \$3,800 grant transformed the kitchen into a quiet, child friendly waiting area which also provides confidentiality when multiple families are at the center. The appearance of the center helps facilitate participation of children and families as they go through the investigative and healing processes.

## Adams County Historical Society, Inc.

With a grant of \$1,500 and \$500 from its own budget, the Adams County Historical Society purchased two refurbished laptops and a projector. The Society uses this technology on and off-site at dozens of educational programs each year, free and open to the public. The laptops have also transformed day-to-day work. Records are better organized and artifacts are safely and efficiently catalogued without having to move them to the desktop computer station.
