Arendtsville Community Fire Company

The Arendtsville Community Fire Co. has been serving the Arendtsville Borough and surrounding townships of Butler, Franklin and Menallen since 1911. Thirty-four volunteers

answer approximately 250 calls per year.

Funds from the Robert C. Hoffman Charitable Endowment Trust were used to replace an outdated fire hose that ruptured at critical times while responding to calls. The delay to dismantle the hose and replace sections resulted in additional property damage and is a safety issue. COVID-19 presented significant challenges in fundraising and the grant received allowed the replacement of the hose much sooner.





The grant they were awarded during this cycle will be used to engage C.S. Davidson to prepare a necessary Signage Plan that will meet local, state and federal regulations. While street markings have been provided for those utilizing the inner loop, directional signage helping people find important destinations such as the Gettysburg National Military Park, Gettysburg Rec Park, Hospital, Post Office, downtown commercial areas, etc. is the next step in the process.



Adams County Library System

The Mission of the Adams County Library System (ACLS) is to connect people to resources that enrich their lives through the core values of stewardship, excellence and trustworthiness. ACLS serves all of Adams County through their six branches located in Gettysburg, Littlestown, Carroll Valley, New Oxford, East Berlin and Biglerville.

Funds received by ACLS were used to replace multi-person seating areas with furnishings that allow for social distancing and are easily sanitized. Items included chairs, chairs with tablet arms and tables. Additionally, information racks were able to be added to the Gettysburg location for non-profit organizations to display their materials. Due to the extensive use of the furniture, high quality, durable items are needed, which have a higher price. The new furniture is also flexible and moveable to allow for collaborative work and

Pennsylvania Immigration Resource Center

The Pennsylvania Immigration Resource Center (PIRC) provides free legal representation, legal counsel, education and advocacy to help immigrants obtain or protect their legal status in nine south central PA counties. With focus areas of immigrant survivors of domestic violence and naturalization services, they have collaborated in Adams County with Survivors, now Safe Home through the Hanover YWCA, and are expanding partnerships to include the YWCA of Gettysburg & Adams County.



This grant allowed PIRC to expand their outreach in Adams County and create new strategic partnerships with local organizations. The educational programming included

> two Citizenship Eligibility and Immigration 101 presentations and a Know Your Rights presentation.

PIRC was also able to set up informational tables at several community events and partnered with Manos Unidas, Gettysburg College, Adams County Library System and the Adams Rescue Mission. PIRC Spanish speaking staff attended each event and provided: PIRC general brochure, Spanish and English brochures on their Immigrant Survivors Project Services, Legal referral lists, Immigrant rights "red cards" in English and Spanish, and information on the naturalization process.

Visibility at these events provided connections for future partnerships that will further extend their outreach in Adams County.
