The Community Dental Clinic Capital Campaign is an initiative to move the Clinic to a larger, easily accessible, expanded facility to further meet the dental health needs of our growing community. Our new facility will grow our urgent care program, expand dental specialty services, offer comprehensive dental services in house, provide continuum of care for those in need and host educational programs. The clinic will facilitate more doctors and staff through partnerships with institutions of higher learning, regional hospital systems and other community volunteers and programs. Our expansion is critical due to high costs of care, lack of dental coverage, and lack of integration between the health and dental health care systems. Those without dental health care suffering from active dental disease will have a pathway to better health.
