# Fighting Dental Decay & COVID-19

This pandemic has challenged health care providers to set the bar for safety. Dental providers, including the Community Dental Clinic, have integrated new infection control standards and requirements to maintain their practices and protect the safety of their staff and patients.

With a strong and well-established commitment to safe and hygienic practices, our clinic is committed to upholding these standards and closely following all CDC requirements in order to safely treat our patients - the low income uninsured adults of Pinellas. We want to assure all our patients and our community supporters that we are going above and beyond to ensure the well-being of all who enter our clinic.

Specifically, we maintain the following practices:

- Wear critical protective gear including surgical masks, shields, gowns and gloves
- Disinfect all surfaces and items between all patients
- Stagger patient appointments to keep patients apart
- Screen patients for COVID symptoms on the phone, upon arrival and following their visit
- Take temperature of all patients
- Ask patients to wait outside until we are ready for them

# **Paying It Forward**

Because the word "community" is right in our name, we realize & respect the importance of community, especially during these challenging times.



When the COVID-19 Pandemic temporarily closed our doors, we used that time to collect the personal protective equipment needed to keep our staff and patients safe. Gloves were not an issue, thanks to a previous, generous donation of exam gloves from Sempermed.


In fact, we had more XS gloves than we could use - so we donated over 88,000 gloves to Pinellas Emergency Preparedness, a local preschool, and the RCS Food Pantry, to help keep their people safe while they provide aid to the community.

# **Meeting the Need for Urgent Dental Care**

The Pinellas County 2019 Community Health Needs Assessment found that 24.5% of the people in our demographic do not receive the dental care they need due to a lack of dental insurance or ability to pay. In addition to the infection and pain in their mouths, a majority of our patients live with related health concerns such as high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, anxiety, and depression-conditions that are exacerbated by dental issues. The people who come to us truly suffer with acute dental pain and the real fear of losing their health and the few resources they possess.


We are the last stop before the Emergency Room for over 80% of our urgent care patients who live with pain and infection from broken and rotting teeth, diseased gums, and serious oral decay. The other 20% of our urgent care patients already visited the ER and received antibiotics, but not long-term resolution, for their dental problems. At our clinic, we can treat the underlying dental conditions that cause inflammation and peril, then we can provide the appropriate dental care to take away the pain and fear so patients can get back to work, and back to their normal lives.

Thanks to new partnerships with Morton Plant Hospital, Mease Countryside Hospital & Mease Dunedin Hospital, as well as compassionate grants from the Florida Association of Free & Charitable Clinics, Delta Dental, Florida Blue, Patterson Dental, Pinellas Community Foundation, and the Sun Coast Osteopathic Foundation, we are able to provide this critical dental care more than four days a week, and rescue the low income uninsured adults in our community from the acute pain and peril of dental distress. Since January, we have treated 267 acute patients who would have otherwise gone to the ER or urgent care to escape their pain.









### No Teeth? No Problem in Carol's Corner!

Carol's Corner was created by kind & thoughtful volunteer, Carol Lowrey, who wanted to help the many patients who are unable to chew due to tooth pain or extractions. She created a pantry of soft foods, which we offer to patients who must follow a liquid/soft diet for 1 to 3 days following an extraction or other major procedure. Previously, these patients didn't have the ability to get the proper foods after treatment & either suffered without or ate something they shouldn't.

Now Carol's Corner supplies them with essential food to stay healthy & heal. We can always use more! Interested in contributing? We can use:

### **Pinellas Community Foundation Provides Several Generous Grants**



- \$30,000 in Senior Citizens ACT II funding to focused services for seniors
- \$10,000 grant to maintain and expand clinic operations
- \$7,991 Capital Grant to replace our inadequate vacuum system
- \$7,954 **Resiliency Grant** to retrofit the clinic with added safety devices, UV filters, bio monitors, and x-ray sensor to minimize cross contamination of patients

### X-Ray Vision!

Thanks to an amazing anonymous donor, we received a 3D panoramic x-ray to better examine our patients' mouths, teeth and jaws. This advanced technology enables us to x-ray 180° views of our patients' mouths to clearly see the "roots" of their problems - so we can do more to help them. Now we can more effectively screen for infections, cancers, and other pathologies that we could not see on regular x-rays.

Since it was installed March 6, this unit has helped us to identify a bone abscess, and to extract several complex wisdom teeth that would have previously been referred to an oral surgeon (at a substantial cost to our patients).

In addition, this device can provide a 3D image of our patient's teeth, gums, jaw bones and nerves to document the extent of damage and treatment needed.

### Forget Waldo! Where in the World is my PPE?

### **Equity or Equality?**

While these words look alike **Equality** means to distribute support equally to everyone. **Equity** means to distribute support proportionally to everyone based on need. Imagine a pie. **Equality** cuts the pie into 8 equal pieces — 1 per person. **Equity** cuts the pie into 8 different sized pieces based on the need of each person. A starving person would get a larger slice of pie than a well-fed person. In the end, everyone gets the right amount of pie to be healthy.

In the US, not everyone needs the same amount of dental pie. Blacks (non-Hispanics) and Mexican Americans aged 35–44 yrs have 2X as much **untreated tooth decay** as non-Hispanic whites. Adults aged 35–44 yrs with less than a high school education have 3X the untreated tooth decay and/or destructive periodontal disease as adults with a least some college education. And 42% of all U.S. adults have some form of periodontitis - 59.8% for adults aged 65+.

At the Community Dental Clinic, we provide equitable dental care - doing all we can to relieve dental distress for all Pinellas adults without dental insurance or the resources to seek treatment.
