

Where the white gleam of our bright star is cast.


God of our weary years,

True to our native land.



Elementary School Dreamers and Doers

Dr. Malinda Jackson-James retired from the Leon County School District after a stellar 35-year career in the education arena. These years included ten years as an elementary classroom teacher, five years as the district's first Affirmative Action & Recruitment Specialist; four and one-half years as its first Coordinator for Equity/Recruitment; nine years as its first Director of Equal Opportunity Programs, and six years as its "first African American", Executive Director of Employee Relations/Recruitment & Equity. For several years, she served as a member of the Planning Committee for the "Annual MLK Breakfast."









Dr. Kathleen L. Rodgers

Middle School, High School and

Special Schools Dreamers and Doers

Dr. Kathleen Rodgers retired from Leon County Schools in 2022. She is a career educator with almost four decades of experience serving in extensive leadership roles. During her tenure, she was a teacher, assistant principal, principal, an Assistant Superintendent for the Office of Prevention, Intervention, Equity and Support Services. Over the course of her career, she received many recognitions for her dedication, commitment, and passion for the profession, including being chosen as Leon County Schools Teacher of the

Year, the Ida S. Baker Minority Educator of the Year, and The Glenn-Howell Distinguished Educator of the Year. While she was the principal of Kate Sullivan Elementary School, she had the honor of leading a two-time National Blue Ribbon School. Under her leadership, she was instrumental in bringing Bellevue Middle School from a "D" grade to within a few points of a "B" grade. Dr. Rodgers is the founder of the SHARPE Project (Shaping and Helping Adolescents to be Responsible, Positive, and Excellent). The SHARPE project was designed to reduce the rate of students recommended for expulsion by teaming them with mentors.

Dr. Rodgers' commitment to meeting the needs of all students is unparalled. She has an extensive track record of supporting the local community through meaningful volunteer work by serving on the Capital City Youth Services Board and on the Board of the African Caribbean Dance Theatre. In addition, she has spearheaded multiple clothing and blanket donation drives in support of Grace Mission and so much more.

Public Defender Jessica Yeary, Second Judicial Circuit

Attorney Jessica Yeary is the Public Defender for Florida's Second Judicial Circuit. This includes Leon, Gadsden, Wakulla, Franklin, Jefferson and Liberty counties. A criminal defense attorney for over a decade, she is Board Certified in Criminal Trial Law and proudly served two terms as President of the Tallahassee Chapter of the Florida Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers. She has defended thousands of clients accused of a broad range of crimes from initial arrests to jury trials. She spent her early years as an assistant public defender – defending over 200 clients at a time in county court –



before being promoted to circuit court where she represented clients in the felony division.

She was elected in 2020, and continues to handle cases in the courtroom, currently defending all of the children charged as adults in her office. In 2023, she won the Tallahassee Bar Association's Richard W. Ervin Equal Justice Award for her unwavering commitment to indigent defense.

Attorney Yeary frequently educates students in the community about the criminal legal system. Her team works with the scholars of the Pre-Law Magnet Academy of Legal Studies at R. Frank Nims Middle School. Her office also works with Florida State University through an internship program for undergraduate students. The Public Defender's Office is routinely engaged in community events and strives to connect their clients with supportive resources and non-profit organizations.

She was born and raised in Cape Coral, Florida and attended the University of Florida and Stetson University College of Law. She is married to Attorney Ryan Yeary of Caminez & Yeary PA in Monticello and they are the proud parents of two boys.


Swift Creek Middle School

therapy practice.


SAIL High School
