With a sound that ranges from folk country to acoustic pop, Timothy Scott's EP “Wanna Tell You Now” serves listeners a wide variety of well-crafted songs with hooky melodies and hopeful lyrics complimented by Timothy's smooth Southern tenor vocals.

Although he frequently writes on the ukulele, the uke is only one of many acoustic instruments giving life to the EP *Wanna Tell You Now*, recorded and produced in Nashville by Thomm Jutz. The CD showcases the versatility of Charlotte, North Carolina songwriting team Timothy Scott and his wife Sarah, who craft songs evoking everything from Bakersfield in the early 1960s to the power folk ballads of the seventies to the coffee shop pop of today.

Beer in the Doghouse offers a humorous perspective on marital quarrels which could be taken for a Gram Parsons' classic if this modern day doghouse were not equipped with ESPN. ***The Cowboy Inside*** will also be a favorite of fans of the Bakersfield sound.

The title track, ***Wanna Tell You Now*** has a hooky optimistic melody reminiscent of classic pop artists like Buddy Holly. Timothy's hopefulness, which is present throughout, is also evident in the acoustic pop offering ***Love in the Light***, and in the soaring chorus of ***Stronger Than Before***.

My Carolina Girl takes the listener to a small mountain town, both in story and bluegrass inspired instrumentation, demonstrating Timothy's ability to effectively cross genres and reach a wide audience.
