Communities Environment Program \$22,000 awarded to 2nd Northmead Scout Group.

In October, our group was invited to apply for a Communities Environment Grant by our local Federal Member for Mitchell, the Hon Alex Hawke. This was a federal initiative administered by the Department of Industry, Innovation and Science aimed at delivering positive environmental and social outcomes by providing communities the resources, skills and knowledge to care for the environment.

We were successful in our application and will be partnering with Dragonfly Environmental to eradicate noxious weeds and trees and replant our grounds with native species. This will be a scouting and community event running for the next 12 months.

Make sure you keep an eye out for opportunities to be involved in this project, either as a patrol activity or as part of the broader community.

Don't forget that you can apply for the Active Kids Voucher <https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/transaction/apply-active-kids-voucher> which will reduce fees by \$100 and if you apply again in July it will essentially halve your fees for the year!

Once you have downloaded your voucher, you can redeem it via the ScoutsNSW site <https://www.nsw.scouts.com.au/activekids/>. You will need your child's membership number for this, which you can find on the Care Monkey app in your child's profile (under Sharing/Organisations) or email northmeadscoutgroup@gmail.com.

Whilst it was exciting to receive a grant to do some much needed environmental work around the hall, there is still a major short fall in being able to replace/repair gear or purchase new equipment. "ONE JOURNEY" IS ABOUT CONSISTENCY IN THE SCOUTS' PERSONAL PROGRESSION. INSTEAD OF STARTING OVER WITH NEW BADGES IN EACH SECTION, THE SCOUT CAN CONTINUE TO BUILD UPON THE SKILLS OBTAINED PREVIOUSLY IN 'LEVELS'.

The youth program in scouting is the totality of learning opportunities from which young people can benefit (what), created to achieve the purpose of scouting (why), and experienced through the scout method (how).

It was developed to ensure that scouting remained relevant and engaging to young Australians in the 21st Century. There were numerous surveys, focus groups, meetings, research and visits to events which culminated in a number of reports which were used to devise the New program concept. Feedback was open for a 10 month period in 2016/17 and the concepts were refined and tested on 'pioneer' groups such as 1st Carlingford Scout Group.

2nd northmead will be transitioning to the New Youth Program in 2020 and will soon be starting some preparation for this to occur. There may be a requirement for your joey, cub or scout to attend some training and this is scheduled for May.
