

## Peafowl

Are you as proud as a peacock? This phrase comes from the fact that peacocks, or male peafowl, have a huge set of feathers, or a train, that spread out around their bodies. These feathers are used to attract mates. Interestingly, the peafowl's scientific name is *Pavo cristatus*. "Pavo" means turkey in Spanish. Peacocks are more closely related to pheasants than to turkeys.

## Glossary

<b>Forage</b> ( <i>Four-edge</i> )	To search for and find food
<b>Pheasant</b> ( <i>Fez-int</i> )	A bird closely related to the peacock. It is native to Asia and Europe.
<b>Ostentation</b> ( <i>Ah-sten-tay-shus</i> )	A group of peafowl. Ostentatious is an adjective that means “showy” or “show off”.
<b>Train</b> ( <i>Trane</i> )	Name for the long, feathers of the peacock
