## Glossary

<b>Nocturnal</b> (nock-turn-el)	Awake or active at night
<b>Adjective</b> ( <i>add-jek-tiv</i> )	Part of a sentence that describes a person, place, or thing (Examples: Large, small, red, winged)
<b>Omnivore</b> (om-nih-vor)	Eats a mixture of plants and animals
<b>Venom</b> ( <i>veh-num</i> )	It can make you sick. Toxic. Poisonous
<b>Spur</b> ( <i>sper</i> )	Piece of bone that acts like a spike or poker
<b>Rival</b> ( <i>ri-vel</i> )	An enemy or opponent
<b>Nursery burrow</b> ( <i>ner-ser-y bur-row</i> )	An underground place where baby animals can be safe
