

R.V. Parking Rules

First, some information about the property surrounding Anhalt Halle:

Our hall is a historic landmark. There are no asphalt or concrete paved parking areas. The area is hilly and has good run-off from rain. The soil is mostly caliche with sparse grass, a few rocks and scattered oak trees on shallow topsoil in many areas. Getting stuck or sinking in mud has never been a problem.

The gate for RV parking will open at 7am on Friday, April 17th. Please have your RV parked by 12 noon on Friday, April 17th. If for some reason you can't make it by then, please contact us at info@anhaltwesternroundup.com.

You will be **“Dry Camping”**.

❖ Other than showing you where you can park, **we will NOT be providing any “hook-ups” or services of any kind for any type of recreational vehicle or trailer during the Anhalt Western Roundup Event.** Having said that, please plan ahead and be aware of the following:

- *Treat your neighbor as you would like to be treated. Remember, you will most likely have another RV of some sort next to you. Please be courteous.
- *Please make your RV footprint as small as is reasonably possible. We need the space for others to enjoy the event.
- *Make sure your generator is in good running order and not smoking or noisy. Bring enough fuel in appropriate containers **and** have a fire extinguisher handy.
- *Absolutely **NO DUMPING OF GREY OR BLACK WATER ON THE GROUND FROM YOUR HOLDING TANKS.** You are in the Texas Hill Country and the ground is very cavernous. You might pollute someone's well water in the area, and they wouldn't appreciate that.
- *There are NO dump stations on our property, so if you fill your holding tanks up, it is up to you to transfer the waste without spilling. You can bring an RV caddy if you feel the need and plastic sheathing to put under the caddy is also a good idea. You may also use any of the portable restrooms that will be outside the gate. Again, please plan ahead.
- ***NO OUTSIDE FIRES OF ANY KIND, not even in a BBQ pit.**
- *We will not be supplying water for RVs, so bring enough water for your needs. You can purchase potable water containers & transfer pumps at almost any RV supply store or online. Again, please plan ahead.
- *As stated on our FAQ page, you are in the Texas Hill Country and the ground tends to not be very level. So you might want to bring some wood blocking (2”X6” lumber etc.) to level up your RV tires just in case your parking area isn't very level. (I have personally done this myself many times in New Mexico and Colorado National Forest. It isn't hard to do.)
