Trash collection reminder: Monday and Thursday are trash days, recycling day is Monday, green waste day is Monday.

Green Waste Guidelines require loose materials such as grass, clippings and leaves should be placed in a reusable container or a CLEAR OR TRANSLUCENT garbage bag and tied closed. Green waste should be set out at the curb at least four feet from other objects.

Please do not place green waste in your city issued garbage or recycling cart.

FBISD Aquatic Club has been working evenings year round with water polo players to develop training skills to help them make varsity! Trash Collection Reminder

Trash Pickup Day: MONDAY & THURSDAY
Recycling Day: MONDAY
Green Waste Day: MONDAY

When taking out your garbage and recycling carts, remember:

- Ensure all materials fit in the cart. Only items placed inside the cart will be collected.
- Always keep the lid shut.
- Carts should be placed at the base of the curb (where curbs exist) with the cart wheels against the curb.
- Cart handles should be facing away from the street. Lids should open away from the street.
- Carts should be placed at least three feet apart to ensure the collection truck can service both carts.

After your collection takes place:

- Return your carts to your property no later than 8 a.m. on the morning following the day of collection.
- Carts must be stored on your property, in compliance with deed restrictions. Do not store your cart in the alley or on the street.
- The cart remains the property of the City of Sugar Land. It is yours to use while participating in the program. If you move, leave the cart at the residence.

Bulky Waste

Bulky waste service is provided on a flexible on-call basis. Visit www.sugarlandtx.gov/518/Bulky-Waste for more information or call Republic Services at 713-726-7307.

- The service allows residents to schedule 12 bulky waste collections per year.
- Do not set out your bulky waste until you have a confirmed service day.
- The City offers 3 additional bulky waste collections following the Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's holidays at no additional cost.
- Additional bulky waste collections are available for a fee. Fees must be paid prior to scheduling the service.

Keep it Safe and Clean!

Your friendly HOA Board kindly reminds its beloved residents to please maintain your home's driveway, sidewalks, brick/wood exterior, and street area. While we realize that it's more fun to focus on beautifying your yard, flowerbeds and/or garden, tending to the aforementioned areas also contribute to the beautification and safety of your home and the neighborhood.

As for driveways and sidewalks, please ensure they are kept cleaned and free of debris. This summer's extreme heat and temperatures has significantly reduced essential moisture and rain which helps naturally wash off these concrete pathways. You can power wash the concrete or contact a local handy man or contractor to perform the service for you. Wear safety glasses, gloves and rain/rubber boots for added protection while power washing.

Please keep your driveway and sidewalk expansion slots clean and trimmed if you have grass or weed overgrowth. Pouring a small amount of white vinegar in the expansion slots will kill any existing growth, just be careful in the area where the slots meet the grass line.

If you have pine trees that shed, please remove the needles from the sidewalks and streets. Many residents, including parents with kids in strollers and bike riders, have had to walk/ride on the street to avoid slipping on the pine needles, making them vulnerable to a potential street accident from oncoming traffic. We've had several reports of folks speeding through the neighborhood so keeping your sidewalks clean and clear provides a safer pathway for everyone.

As for brick and/or wood exteriors, you can carefully power wash those areas, too. There are several mold and mildew cleaners available, many of them made from natural, bio-degradable agents which effectively remove surface mold and mildew. The water/mix solution is also safe for surrounding plants and grass areas.

If you own a power washer and would like to help out some of your elderly neighbors who are unable to perform and/or afford these services, simply offer to power wash their driveway and sidewalks for them. Working together makes our community brighter and stronger!

SCHOOL ZONE DRIVING SAFETY TIPS

- Be on the lookout for school zone signals and ALWAYS obey the speed limits.
- When entering a school zone, be sure to slow down and obey all traffic laws.
- Always stop for school busses that are loading or unloading children.
- Watch out for school crossing guards and obey their signals.
- Be aware of and watch out for children near schools, bus stops, sidewalks, in the streets, in school parking lots, etc.
- Never pass other vehicles while driving in a school zone.
- Never change lanes while driving in a school zone.
- Never make U-Turns while driving in a school zone.
- Never text while driving in a school zone.
- Avoid using a cell phone, unless it is completely hands-free, while driving in a school zone.
- Unless licensed to do so, never use handicap or emergency vehicle lanes or spaces to drop off or pick up children.
