WHAT CAN I DO ABOUT SOLICITORS IN THE COMMUNITY?

The City of Sugar Land can-not forbid door-to-door Salespeople, Peddlers, or Solicitors. As a resident or property owner, if you wish to discourage some, you can fill out a form online that advises the City that Peddlers and Solicitors are not welcome and their entry on property at the provided address is forbidden. The form can be found at: sugarlandtx.gov/formcenter and by clicking on the link ti-tled: "No Solicitation Registration". More information about solicitation can be found in the Code of Ordinances section within the tab labeled "Government".

2022 HOA ASSESSMENT DUE JANUARY 31ST

The last day to make your payment for the 2022 annual assessment was January 31, 2022. All past due accounts will be assessed interest in the amount of 10% per annum. A letter will be mailed after February 15th to all homeowners with past due balances. A certified demand letter, and a collection fee being assessed to the account, will be sent after March 15th. All past due accounts will be turned over to the association's attorney for collection after April 15th. The collection process will be pursued to the full extent of the law, including foreclosure if necessary.
