The City of Sugar Land cannot forbid door-to-door Salesman, Peddlers, or Solicitors. As a resident or property owner, if you wish to discourage some, you can fill out a form online that advises the City that Peddlers and Solicitors are not welcome and their entry on property at the provided address is forbidden. The form can be found at: sugarlandtx.gov/formcenter and by clicking on the link titled: "No Solicitation Registration". More information about solicitation can be found in the Code of Ordinances section within the tab labeled "Government".

be lowering the cost to \$5 for each resident pool ID card and maintain the \$5 admin charge, a family of four cost savings of \$20.

Each resident that wants to utilize the pool will need a pool ID card. Last year we used tags. This year we will be having pool ID cards with residents' pictures and year stickers, which will assist the life guards in checking you properly into the pool and adhering to a strict policy of residents and their guests only.

We will also be expanding the pool hours a few days a week during the height of the season to assist in mothers with young children, allowing them to share in the pool before the heat of the day. We had heard from a number of mothers on this, so we are going to give it a try.

The Board is also researching some other improvements to the pool. stay tuned. I am looking forward to hearing results to this quest.

A few reminders – Improvements to the front of your home and yard.

On the Covington Woods website, you can find the ACC form – Architectural Control Committee, This needs to be submitted in advance of improvements to your home. This is a requirement of the deed restrictions that you agreed upon when you moved into this neighborhood. The ACC Committee is very responsive and agrees to most requests. Submitting and getting approval is a better alternative than doing an unapproved improvement with the possibilities of removing your changes.

Let's make it a great 2019. Love your family and treat your neighbors with respect.

Weed and feed your yard, plant some flowers and trees to beautify your home and neighborhood.

Pick up the clutter and trash from the front of your home and street. The Board wants the best for the community and neighborhood. We live here also. As a licensed realtor I see many neighborhoods and the ones that show pride increase in value and homes sell faster.
