Did you know February is the month of Pet Dental Care?

What causes periodontal disease?

Periodontal disease is caused by bacteria (plaque) which sticks to the tooth's surface and builds up after every meal and treat. Within days it hardens and calcifies becoming that yellow tartar you can see on the dogs teeth.

What are symptoms of periodontal disease?

Bad breath is the first sign of periodontal disease. As the disease progresses dogs and cats may find eating difficult as well as excessive drooling and you may find that their gums bleed!

How is periodontal disease treated?

Treatment depends on the severity of the periodontal disease. Gingivitis can be treated by simple teeth cleaning, scraping of any tartar, application of a fluoride solution and gel to help prevent any further bacteria sticking to the freshly cleaned teeth! In the most severe cases of periodontal disease the veterinarian will anaesthetise your fur baby and give a deep scale and polish, administer antibiotics (if required) and in some really bad cases tooth/teeth removal will be needed!

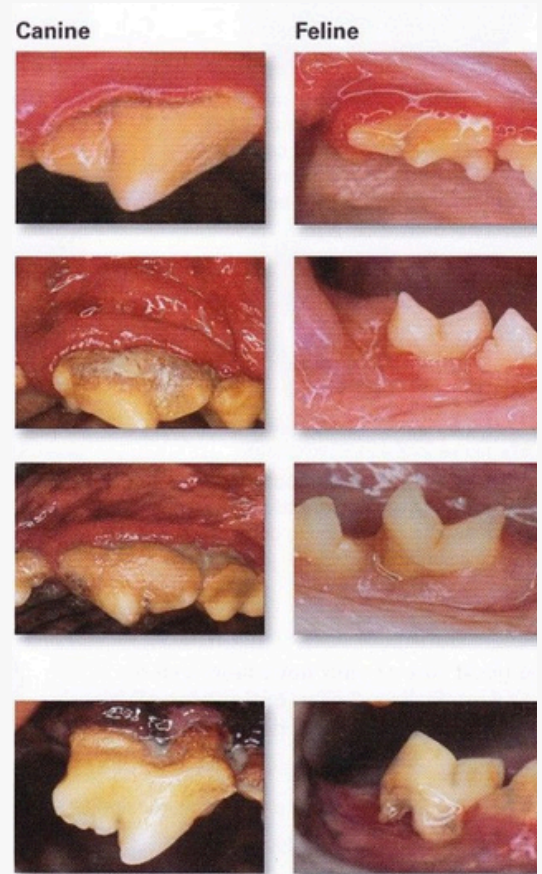

I use the latest technology when cleaning dogs and cats teeth. My process includes;

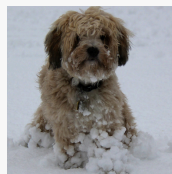
- Emmipet ultrasonic tooth brush - cleans even the narrowest interdental spaces without noise and scrubbing
