





The adventures of a “Dress A Girl” Dress
The dresses have a long journey before they arrive in

the village. Recently I spoke with Dr. Safo about how the dresses get to their final destination. She told me that she takes the dresses to a barrel packer in New York. There they are packed into 55 gallon drums along with other items that the doctor sends to Ghana. When the barrel is fully packed it is shipped off to Accra, Ghana via ship.

Upon arrival in Accra, it is welcomed by a sea of government bureaucracy and then released to the recipient. In the case of these dresses, the barrel got lost in the process and then had to be located.

The barrel is then unpacked the dresses are driven to a church in the Volta Region which is in the eastern-most part of Ghana on the Togo boarder. There the travelers and the dresses meet up with drivers who will take them close to the village. The orphanage is set in the countryside and is not accessible by car. They carry the dresses walking 4-5 miles to get to village. Ghana is a hot place with high temperatures averaging 85 degrees in April and the thought of carrying anything for four to five miles on rugged terrain is mind-boggling.
