Grand Knight's Message June 2017 Knight Light Alleluia! Alleluia! He is Risen!

The message may seem dated but remember there are 50 days of Easter. Easter is the celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church on Pentecost. The Easter message can be summarized in one bible verse where Jesus is speaking to the disciples; "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." - John 15:13

This overpowering bible verse is also appropriate for the heroes we pay tribute to on Memorial Day. While the display, flamboyance and glitz of the parade was lost to the weather that day, the genuine intention of Memorial Day went forward with the Wreath Laying Ceremony at John Walsh Memorial Park honoring those who gave their lives for you and me and all of the American people so we can live in freedom. Many of these men and women are near and dear to us, Fathers, Mothers, Sons or Daughters, Brothers or Sisters, other family members or friends. But the vast majority of the brave unselfish men and women we honor are nameless and faceless to us. And yet on a day when the chilly and wet weather forced the cancellation of the parade the East Northport community gathered to remember them, their devotion to a nation and its ideals and that they gave up their lives for us.

The month of May started in a solemn way. May $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ was the wake and funeral of our past Chaplain Father Lawrence O'Leary. On the first night of the wake the room was filled with Knights, Columbiettes, and Honor Guard from the Order. There were three separate prayer services offered that evening. One by the Fr. Judge Knights and Columbiettes, one by the 4th Degree Honor Guard and one by the Coram Fire Department where Fr. O'Leary also served as Chaplain. It was easy to see how loved Fr. O'Leary was and how much he will be missed. Fr. O'Leary's funeral Mass was held at the Maria Regina Chapel and was co-celebrated by several bishops, active and retired, from Rockville Center including our new Bishop John Barres. The funeral procession departed Maria Regina Residence in Brentwood, traveled through the town of Coram where Fr. O'Leary was pastor of Mother Cabrini Parish many years ago, chaplain of Mother Cabrini Council as well as serving the Fire Department. From Coram we continued out to Southampton where Father was laid to rest with his parents. This would have been an impossible trip if not for the impeccable escort from Suffolk County Police arranged by Dr. Ray.

Several efforts are under way to keep Father O'Leary's memory alive in our council, parish and community. These include a Father Lawrence O'Leary Scholarship Fund (additional information inside) and the naming the newly refurbished visiting clergy quarters at St. Anthony's in his honor. This apartment over the rectory garages was refurbished by the Brother Peter Dawson Squires. Other ideas are being considered.

On Sunday, May 21st we held our Communion Mass / Breakfast. Approximately 40 members and their families were in attendance. The 4th degree Honor Guard turned out in force to attend our Mass and breakfast. After Mass we were treated to a delightful breakfast prepared and served by our cooks at the Fr. Judge Hall. Bob and Dee Sanicola chaired this event. On May 1st we participated in the May Crowning of Mary with the Catholic Daughters and our Columbiettes. Each pew of the church had at least one occupant as a living Rosary was said up and down the pews. Monsignor Mirro directed the service which included prayer and songs. Our own Bob Slingo acted





Knight Light Event Guidelines

To help keep producing a quality Knight Light, Brothers and Sisters need to think in advance of the coverage that they want. They should consider pictures and story. If they don't care, we will try to do what we can but it works best when the managers give attention to coverage. I would appreciate it if managers would copy me on their event correspondence and include me in meetings if I can attend.

Event managers should have event coverage as an agenda item at their event meetings. We will try to attend meetings to help with this but I am often away. It is best to have one person to take pictures and one person to cover the story and it is really good when they work as a team. George Morrish and Joe Dipenta are usually available for pictures and I am less available. Any Brother or Sister can take pictures. All you need is a cell phone. Thought should go into photography and we don't want to get every picture that is taken. All pictures require editing and sizing and most need to be tossed. Very few people do this and I think I have to accept this.

If the event managers want a flyer, they need to work it up but we can help. We prefer ¹/₄ Page ads at least to start. Non Council religious events should be ¼ page but we have been accepting full page ads. Before ads appear, there should be lead-up. There should be an announcement in the KL as soon as an event is scheduled. This will set off an alarm for unanticipated conflicts. The announcement should be repeated and enhanced every month until the event happens. We will request a monthly update by email but it may not be necessary to change the announcement every month. Every announcement should be repeated or updated each month until the event happens.

I cannot use PDF for ads or articles in the KL. Submitting PDFs is a new and annoying phenomenon. I may be a cause of this problem because I send drafts in PDF as it is universally receivable. PDF conversion programs do not work well. The technology to convert is new and awful. Usually it is best to do a print screen but this yields a week result. I often have to reconstruct an ad from scratch if it is submitted in PDF format.

After the event, I need the pictures and story quickly especially toward the end of the month. Sometimes it is necessary to put off the coverage of an event until the following month. Bob Spera, Editor, Knight Light




