The Grand Knight's Message December, 2016

Brother Knights, Sister Columbiettes, Family and Friends of Father Judge Council,

The season of Advent is upon us and what better time to examine our lives. As we await the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ at Christmas, Advent is a time for preparation. On the first Sunday of Advent the first reading, Isaiah 2:1-5, gives us a wonderful personal Advent checklist.

Isaiah tells us the Lord's mountain, is the highest of all mountains.

Is the Lord's mountain the highest mountain in my life? Or do I have other mountains that are higher? Wealth? Possessions? Career? Family?

Isaiah also tells us that all nations and people will flow to the Lord.

Do the internal rivers of my life flow to the Lord? In my public life? In my private life? In my thoughts? Emotionally? Finally, Isaiah tells us the Lord will show us his ways and set forth the law.



In case you have not heard yet, our last Saturday Night Bingo session will be Saturday Night, December 10th. We have decided not to renew our bingo license for 2017. Bingo was started in 1992 to help finance our Council Hall. Over the past 25 years many Brothers and their families have put in 1000s of hours working Saturday Night Bingo. Sometimes under some very difficult conditions. Do you remember when the players were allowed to smoke during the game? And there were more than 125 people in attendance? You could hardly see the other side of the room through the smoke cloud!

To all the Brothers and their families who worked Saturday Night Bingo for our council your Grand Knight extends a sincere Thank You and ask that God continues to Bless you.



Fr. Judge Dinner Club

Brothers, one idea to help replace our lost Bingo revenue was to start a Dinner Club at our council. The Dinner Club offers members of the club a chance to go to dinner up to six times during a calendar for less than half the cost of going to a restaurant. Dinners would be scheduled on Friday nights during the year and the schedule would be pre-published.

Below is how the Fr. Judge Dinner Club would work. To join the Fr. Judge Dinner Club potential members would be required to purchase a minimum of six (6) shares. Shares would cost ~\$25 - \$30 (exact price would be predetermined) each and would need to be prepaid. *Example*: If the share cost was \$30, it would a member a minimum of \$180 (purchasing the minimum 6 shares) to join the club.

Each share would be good for one (1) person to attend one (1) dinner. *Example:* A member to attend all six dinners during the year by himself or attend three of the dinners during the year with a guest.

The prepaid shares are non-refundable but can be transferred to others.

A member would need to make a reservation by Tuesday of the week the dinner is scheduled for to participate in that particular dinner.

Dinners would consist of a salad, an entrée (beef, chicken, or pasta) with sides and dessert.

Members could purchase additional shares when they initially join the club.

The Fr. Judge Dinner Club will be marketed as "Dinner and". The "and" is an entertainment component that brings added value to the event. It might be a movie on our big screen TV, music for dancing, karaoke, or a magic act.







Alan Bergman and Wally Malone describe the terrors of 9/11 and its aftermath.


These military tributes were followed by tributes to
