Brothers, Sisters, and friends please remember the sick and deceased members of our Fr. Judge Family in your prayers.






for golf! It was even more perfect for Tony Cornetta and Joe Lupo, shown at left as they drove around selling 50-50 chances on the par 3 16th hole.




