As we end the month of April, there is no denying that we faced some challenging times. During these past several weeks we have witnessed the devasting toll COVID-19 has taken all around the world. For many of us, we are experiencing what may be the most trying times of our lives. We watched as the economy took a turn for the worst. Many of us may have lost their job, questioning the financial stabilities of our future. We hear each day news of a friend or loved one who contracted the virus. Many of us have received news over the past several weeks that the virus has taken the life of someone we loved and cared about. Our Fr. Judge Family unfortunately could not steer clear of the virus' relentless and undiscriminating path and we've had Family members contract the illness, some of whom are now in peace with God.

As we enter the month of May, we approach the third Sunday after Easter. As I look back over the years at the trials and tribulations, we, as a Country, have suffered through, I am reminded of stories of the kindness and generosity people offered to others in those times of crisis. I am reminded of the resilience we as Americans have – how we are able to pull together in these moments like at no other time with a helping hand to those in need.

We don't know what the future may bring. But we do know that if we continue working together, helping each other, and taking the proper steps to help slow the spread, this crisis will pass. So while it may look bleak at times and social distancing makes these times a little harder, try to remain positive. We will be able to get through this.

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

The purpose of these awards (\$1,000 for 1st place and \$500 for 2nd place) is to provide financial assistance to an applicant to further his or her Catholic High School education. This scholarship is a onetime award per student.

- Applicant must be enrolled in a Catholic High School, grade 9, 10, 11 or 12 as of September 2020. Proof of acceptance is required. Grade average at time of application must be a minimum of 2.0 or a "C". Transcript of latest grades will be requested.
- Applicant must be related to a member of Fr. Thomas A. Judge Council, Knight or Columbiette, in good standing, living or deceased, or be a Squire.
- Application must indicate student's involvement in Church, Community or School activities and must include a statement from a Priest, program mentor, teacher, counselor, etc. as to student's character.
- An essay entitled, "How my Catholic background helps me be a better person for myself and for others." Essay should not exceed 150 type written words.
- Signature of parent or guardian is required.

Applications should be submitted to Fr. Thomas A. Judge Council, P.O. Box 1151, East Northport, NY 11731. Attn: Mark R. Guarriello, GK, and must be post marked no later than May 30, 2020. Scholarship award will be presented to the student at the Council's June 2020, meeting. Student's application will be given a numerical identification. Names will not be available to Scholarship Committee members.

The decision of the Committee is final.
