

GOLF CART SAFETY AWARENESS

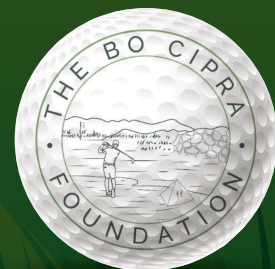

With the increase in popularity there has unfortunately been a rise in accidents related to this type of vehicle. Often, this is due to misuse of the golf cart. The Bo Cipra Foundation knows this all too well and we would like to spread awareness of golf cart safety to help prevent further tragedies.



KEY SAFETY TIPS

- Be responsible
- Do not operate the vehicle under the influence or if you are too tired
- There should not be more passengers than there are seats
- No one should be standing on any part of the cart while it is in use
- Read the safety instructions posted on the cart - they are there for a reason
- Go the speed limit assigned for the cart
- If you are driving a cart at night - think of the following:
 - Are there working headlights or brake lights so cars can see you?
 - Do you have turn signals?
 - If you do not have these lights then it is not safe to drive

The back of a golf cart is intended to hold golf bags or other items - not people.



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
