Having received the news about our award win from England FA on 8th June, Richard, Emma and I were all bursting with pride for our club. Unable to share the information with anyone at that time the three of us chatted about how unbelievable it was and how excited we were.

The news was finally announced internally to the club leading up to Trophy Day and the nerves and apprehension of what was to come started to hit home; TV crews, photographers and the trip to Wembley looming. Trophy day was a huge success and interviews were given with plenty of photographs taken to remember the day for everyone. Next up: The Road to Wembley.

The evening before felt like it was the night before Christmas for us all.

An early morning start for everyone as we met up at The Dugout, having been kindly allowed to hire the Cambourne Community Minibus – which was affectionately named Beryl by the 15 of us aboard. Arriving safely in London thanks to Emma's skillful driving, we made our way to the stadium, passing the Royal Box and heading to Club Lounge Wembley.

At this point I was taken off for a quick briefing with England FA on what to expect throughout the day. Suddenly spotting John Barnes and Rachel Yankey just mingling we felt overawed at what we had achieved along with the other winners. We were then shown to our table to spot Sir Geoff Hurst was seated with us!

The awards ceremony commenced with BBC Sports presenter Seema Jaswal our host for the afternoon. Amazing stories were shared as the winners of the national awards were



announced, 12 categories in total. Inspiring young coaches of just 18 years old, life savers and ground staff. Awards announced in blocks of four, with amazing food served between.

We saw Gareth Southgate and Steve Holland just metres away on stage telling stories from their own grassroots beginnings. Finally, it was our turn – number 11 of 12 awards.

John Barnes stepped on stage and our name was announced. Our video played and then it was up on to the stage we all went in front of a room of 400 people.

Feelings of wow and look what we have achieved as a club – all our volunteers, our managers, coaches, youth and adult players all bringing our community together as one.

Then it was now time for the match – and what a match it was! At half time the score was 0-0 and I was looking for the nod from Ben Grady at the FA as it was our moment on the big screen and a trip to the pitch – knowing the crowd size was 81,145 people.

Walking out onto the pitch and representing our club is something I will never ever forget, hearing the enormous cheer when Cambourne Town FC was announced as the National Club of the Year, looking up and spotting my son in the crowd, my immense pride in us all as I looked around and took it all in, wanting to savour the moment and share it with everyone.

After the match we went back to the lounge and enjoyed some rapping to World in Motion from

John Barnes and an amazing rendition of *Sweet Caroline* from Sir Geoff! The incredible band kept the whole room entertained.

Walking back to "Beryl" ready for the journey home all of us were just astounded at what a day we had just had, sharing a room with footballing heroes but also everyday heroes too.

Our club is made up of some amazing people, people who give up their time for others, allowing children to play the sport they love and continue into adulthood and providing a network of lifelong friends. Coaches who give up time with their own families to make sure the team is supported. All volunteers who want to make a difference and what a difference we are making.

Thank you to all of you. It is truly an honour to have represented you at Wembley.
