A good practice for all disciples is to pause and reflect on what we are thankful for and how we have responded in gratitude for God's gifts. It is one place to do a spiritual checkup and ask, "Am I as thankful and generous as God wants me to be?" Then listen to God and see how God helps you answer that question for yourself.



This year's campaign is a chance to do just that. We have mailed packets to our member households with materials to review and reflect on. We have a worksheet to help you look at things. There is a card to return to the church by Giving Sunday which is November 21<sup>st</sup>.

One thing that makes this process most meaningful is seeing where you actually are, and then praying about it. A simple question for God is, "Lord, help me to see what you want me to do and empower me to do it." Most of our growing as people happens when we are open to letting God stretch us. 
Deaconess Andrea educational & candidacy process...

Joyce was a long-time member of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Elgin where she taught Sunday School for many years. She participated in the Prayer Ministry there right up until the time of her death.

When her children were younger, Joyce was very active in the PTA, serving as a room mother and a Girl Scout Leader. Later in life she was proud to serve as an election judge.

She loved music, reading, gardening, going for walks, watching the birds, picking flowers, gazing at the moon, and especially dancing and playing with her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. One of her last acts of kindness was rescuing a kitten that had been born in her garage.

Joyce was love personified! She was a loving, selfless daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother, greatgrandmother, aunt and friend. Both her door and her heart were always open, wrapping everyone she knew in a caring embrace. She made the world a better, happier, kinder, brighter, more beautiful place and she will be dearly missed!
