

USPS 2018 New Issues

Scooby-Doo

1st Class Forever Rate July 14—Bloomington, MN



For nearly 50 years, the call "Scooby-Doo, Where Are You!" has summoned the animated Great Dane wherever help is needed. The USPS, in collaboration with Warner Bros. Consumer Products, is now calling on Scooby to appear on a new Forever stamp. Of additional significance, the stamp is part of a campaign highlighting Scooby's new social responsibility initiative, Scooby-Doo DOO GOOD. His role in this effort is fitting, as Scooby has solved mystery after spooky mystery since his 1969 debut.

Three generations of fans have now embraced Scooby-Doo and the "meddling kids," as his friends are often called by the villains unmasked at the conclusion of each Scooby-Doo mystery. The stamp pictures Scooby helping out by watering a blossoming plant in a flowerpot—a simple act symbolizing a component of the "Doo Good" campaign's to provide young people with tools and activities geared toward enriching the environment. The campaign, launching this year in partnership with Generation On, the youth division of Points of Light, also focuses on helping the hungry and acting as animal allies.

The Art of Magic 1st Class Forever Rate Aug. 7—Las Vegas, NV











The Postal Service celebrates the art of magic with this pane of 20 stamps featuring digital illustrations of five classic tricks magicians use to amaze and delight audiences: a rabbit in a hat (production), a fortune teller using a crystal ball (prediction), a woman floating in the air (levitation), an empty bird cage (vanishing), and a bird emerging from a flower (transformation).



Dragons

1st Class Forever Rate August 9—Columbus, OH

The Dragons stamps will be issued during the APS Stamp Show, to be held August 9-12 in Columbus, Ohio. The four designs present a green fire-breathing dragon towering over a medieval-inspired castle; a purple dragon with orange wings and sharp black armor on its back snaking around a white castle; a black dragon with green wings and green armor on its back swooping past a ship on the sea; and a wingless orange dragon weaving its way around a pagoda.

Throughout history and across the globe—from Europe to the Middle East to Asia to the Americas—people have enjoyed tales of mythological creatures. Though these legendary animals vary in shape, size and color, they're most often described as lizard-like with four legs, sharp claws, scales, wings and spiky tails. The wingless orange dragon weaving its way around a pagoda is inspired by creatures found in Asian art, architecture, folk religion and ancient lore. European folklore inspired the dragons on the purple dragon with orange wings and sharp black armor on its back, and the green fire-breathing dragon.

US Airmail (red)

1st Class Forever Rate August 11 College Park, MD



This red airmail stamp is the companion to the blue version issued May 1. The blue stamp honored Army pilots who initiated the world's first regularly scheduled airmail service, this stamp commemorates the 100th anniversary of the beginning of airmail delivery through the U.S. Post Office Department, which began August 12, 1918.

Show & Tell.....


- 1. Stanley Campbell showed some postcards.

Rockford Stamp Notes August 2018

Countries ending in "Stan" by Tim Wait

We continue with the "New" countries in Central Asia ending in "stan,":

Kazakhstan - Kyrgyzstan - Tajikistan - Turkmenistan - Uzbekistan

As a generally accepted explanation, the suffix "stan" is an ancient Persian and/or Farsi word meaning country, nation, land, or place of, so, the country name of Afghanistan would then mean "homeland" of the Afghans, or place of the Afghans.

Tajikistan, officially the Republic of Tajikistan, mountainvery landlocked country ine ous, in Central Asia with an estimated population of 8.7 million people as of 2016, and an area of 143,100 km² (55,300 sq mi) is bordered Afghanistan to by the south, Uzbekistan to the west, Kyrgyzstan to north, and China to the east. Traditional homelands of the Tajik people includes present-day Tajikistan as well as parts of Afghanistan and Uzbekistan.

Tajikistan issued its first stamp May 20, 1992. It has a very reasonable stamp issuing policy with only 246 stamps through 2004. Most stamps represent local history, people, art or animals.

An interesting note in Scott's catalog, "Illegal" Stamps, lists a number of items such as Elvis, Marilyn Monroe, Batman, Harry Potter, etc. that can appeal to collectors but were not officially issued.



A review on Tajikistan stamps on eBay reveals that few issues are available. With 542 listings, with much duplication and includes some "Illegal" stamps.

Russia **Turkmenistan** a sovereign state in Central bordered Asia, by Kazakhstan to the northwest, Uzbekistan to the north and east, Afghanistan to the southeast, Iran to the south southwest. and the Caspian Sea to the west. Ashgabat is the capital and largest city. The population of the country is 5.6 million, the lowest of the Central Asian republics.

> Turkmenistan has been at the crossroads of civilizations for centuries. In medieval times, Merv was one of the great cities of the Islamic world and an important stop on the Silk Road, a caravan used route for trade with China until the mid-15th century. Annexed by the Russian Empire in 1881, Turkmenistan later figured prominently in the anti-Bolshevik movement Central Asia. In 1925, Turkmenistan became a constituent republic of the Soviet Union, Turkmen Soviet Socialist Republic (Turkmen SSR); it became independent upon the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991.

> Turkmenistan issued its first stamps in 1992. It has a very reasonable stamp issuing policy with only 94 stamps through 2002. Most stamps represent local history, people, art or animals. They also have a list of "Illegal Stamps".

A review on Turkmenistan stamps on eBay reveals that few issues are available. With 565 listings, with much duplication and many non-Scott listed stamps!

Place Names of Winnebago County

Rockton. Village (1847, 1872). Nine miles north of Rockford. Formerly known as Pecatonica. The name was changed about 1846 for the community's location on the Rock River. Thomas B. Talcott, one of the first county commissioners, is generally credited with suggesting the name. **Post Office**; established December 26, 1838 as Pekatonic; changed to Rockton February 26, 1846, active today.

Roscoe. Village (1965). Several histories of Winnebago County claim the Roscoe post office, and subsequently the village and township, were named for William Roscoe (1753-1831), the eminent English attorney and historian. They may, however, have been named for a source much closer to home: Charlie Roscoe, a friend of Amos Tuttle. Tuttle was an early settler who laid out the community about 1840. **Post Office**; established July 26, 1837, the earliest in Winnebago County, active today.

Rockton. Village (1847, 1872). Nine miles north of Rockford. Formerly known as Pecatonica. The name was changed about 1846 for the community's location on the Rock River. Thomas B. Talcott, one of the first county commissioners, is generally credited with suggesting the name. **Post Office**; established December 26, 1838 as Pekatonica; changed to Rockton February 26, 1846, active today.

South Beloit. City (1917). Named for its location south of Beloit, Wis., itself founded in the mid-1830s by Caleb Blodgett as New Albany, named for Albany, Vt. According to a first-hand account, a committee to choose a new nam was appointed, and "we proposed several names and finally agreed to place the alphabet in a hat and see if we could not get a combination of letters that would give us a name...While proposing this, Mr. Johnson undertook to sound a French word for handsome ground and in trying spoke 'Bolotte', like Detroit in sound and pretty and original I think. All sounded it and liked it and...it was unanimously adopted". **Post Office**; established before 1931, active today.

Winnebago. Village (1855, 1877). Five miles west of Rockford. Laid out about 1854 with construction of the Galena and Chicago Union Railroad. Named for its location in Winnebago County. Formerly knows as Elda or Elida. **Post Office;** established July 3, 1854, as Winnebago Depot; changed to Winnebago January 29, 1871, active today.

That finishes up all the Winnebago towns, villages and cities. Hope you enjoyed the listings.


