

President's Corner - Frank Schmitt

Greetings fellow Rockford Stamp Club members:

Here we are closing our albums on yet another year. Pandemic measures weren't quite as restrictive as the previous year/s but there were still some considerations to address and for good measure they threw monkey pox into the mix. Of course, now we have the influenza season to be concerned with and I am almost certain some variant of some other malady will rear its ugly head. We each need to determine the best course of action in addressing these concerns as an individual and for our families and communities, and hopefully we will all be safe.

Although stamps shows are coming back with greater frequency there are many that have not survived, some because of lack or loss of venues. Attendance varies at the shows and bourses due to numerous reasons but one of the largest being the impact of internet sales, COVID-19, and now inflation are also contributors. Traveling to and from shows has also become an issue for many due to location, weather, age, and cost of gasoline. Obviously, the internet solves those problems, except one, the face-to-face interaction between collectors and dealers and fellow collectors.

Therein lies the reason to maintain membership and attendance in one or more stamp clubs to enhance your experiences within the hobby. The interaction and sharing of knowledge through regular attendance is healthy for the hobby as well as the individual. Please join us at our Wednesday evening meetings and Tuesday morning auctions and be an active member of our club.

Reportedly, many clubs have had significant decreases in attendance since this turmoil began in spring of 2020. Unfortunately, some of the reasons are "aging-out", health issues, driving restrictions, weather conditions, accessibility issues and so on. All are understandable, but some may be overcome. Should we as a club possibly look at meeting times and days, location, ride share, and any other solutions you may have to offer. We should attempt to make our meetings accessible to the greatest number of members throughout the year not by season or time of day.

I would personally like to see us incorporate more programs on our meeting night. I attended the November meeting of the Janesville Stamp Club, and they incorporate a program into each of their meetings. It was approximately an hour in length showing beautifully illustrated covers of Milwaukee business in the early 1900's. I know our auctions are the highlight of our meetings, but I feel we are missing the boat by not having a program or presentation of some type. The auctions are important to most of the members and the income realized does oftentimes cover our meeting space rent, so I am not proposing we eliminate them. Comments and suggestions are most welcome.

Just a reminder, our December auction is a benefit charity auction for the Ken-Rock kids with the proceeds most often used to fund a Christmas party for them. Sort through your accumulations and assemble some auction lots for this good cause. While you are at it remember to assemble your larger and/or more valuable lots for the silent auction at the **Rock-ford 2-3-4 Stamp Expo** (notice how I snuck that in again). Remember, the dealers oftentimes bid on these lots, so it is a good time to clear out your larger or more valuable items.

First U.S. Christmas Stamp - Frank Schmitt

Sixty years ago, was a first for the United States Post Office Department. After much demand, spanning many years, for a Christmas stamp, it finally happened. November 1, 1962 was the first day of issue for the 4-cent "Candles and



p, it finally happened. November 1, 1962 was the first day of issue for the 4-cent "Candles and Wreath" Christmas stamp Scott #1205. Expecting many complaints and lawsuits for issuing a stamp for a religious holiday the stamp was very basic and avoided the religious aspect as much as possible. It wasn't until 1966 that the USPOD issued a stamp showing the Madonna and Child on a Christmas stamp. In the 1970's it was determined that both a traditional and non-religious Christmas stamp should be issued, which continues to be the practice today. I believe the beauty of this stamp lies in the simplicity and detail.

Numerous Christmas stamps, as well as other secular or ethnically related holiday stamps, have been issued since this first issue. Many have been or are surrounded by controversy, likes, and dislikes due to any number of reasons, including content, design (or lack of), and so on. Not unlike several other stamp issues!

Nov 1, 1962 Pittsburgh, PA. The USPOD anticipated huge demand and printed 350 million stamps. Eventually, over 1 billion stamps were sold!

This Artmaster FDC has two Tuberculosis Christmas seals tied by the cancel making it a nice FDC.

Best laid plans. On January 7, 1963, the USPOD raised the first class letter rate to 5ϕ . Normally a stamp with only a two month rate window would be a fairly rare usage. Since so many stamps were used on Christmas cards, this is not rare. This letter was mailed on the first day of the new rate and charged "Postage Due 1 Cent".
