



2019 New Issues - January

Uncle Sam's Hat

1st Class Additional Ounce 15¢ Coil roll of 100 Jan 27—Kansas City, MO



Among the 2019 postal rate changes, the additional per ounce rate for First Class was reduced from 21¢ to 15¢ per ounce. To meet this rate, the Postal Service brought back the design that was first used in 2017, when the add-on rate was 21¢. The primary difference will be that it will bear a 2019 year date instead of the previous 2017 date.

Known especially for his large top hat decorated in varying patterns of stars and stripes, Uncle Sam has symbolized the American spirit for more than 150 years. The Postal People tell us, "The stamp features eight graphic top hats in Uncle Sam's signature style, with red and white vertical stripes above a blue band with a white star and a gray brim. Beneath each hat is an oval shape representing a face, each in a different shade, meant to suggest the ethnic and racial diversity of the United States."

Cactus Flowers celebrates the beauty of cactus flowers with a booklet of 20 stamps. Each stamp depicts a photograph of the flower of one of these ten cacti: *Opuntia engelmannii, Rebutia minuscula, Echinocereus dasyacanthus, Echinocereus poselgeri, Echinocereus coccineus, Pelecyphora aselliformis, Parodia microsperma, Echinocactus horizonthalonius, Thelocactus heterochromus* and *Parodia scopa*. Within the booklet, each stamp design is featured twice. With new DNA studies, botanists sometimes reclassify plants. As of the printing of these stamps, the scientific names were accurate. Cacti also have common names, with some plants having several different names in popular use. Art director Ethel Kessler designed the stamps with existing photographs taken by John P. Schaefer.

Alabama Statehood 1st Class Forever Rate Pane of 20 Feb 23—Huntsville, AL



Alabama Statehood celebrates the bicentennial of Alabama statehood. Alabama became the 22nd state in the Union on Dec. 14, 1819. The stamp art is a photograph taken at sunset in Cheaha State Park. Alabama photographer Joe Miller took the picture from the park's Pulpit Rock Trail. With Pulpit Rock in the foreground, most of the area in the valley below the overlook is part of the Talladega National Forest, which surrounds the state park. The art director is William J. Gicker. Greg Breeding designed the stamp with Miller's existing photograph.



Rockford Stamp Notes February 2019

United States Revenues - Their Purpose Illustrated by Tim Wait

Boating Stamps (RVB) Starting April 1, 1960, motorboats of more than 10 horsepower required a certificate of registration. These stamps were used in 12 states and the District of Columbia that had not passed laws conforming to the Boating Act of 1958.

The \$3 stamp was attached to the temporary certificate for the owner and the lower part (stub) was affixed to the application and sent by the post office to the U.S. Coast Guard, who issued the permanent certificates. The \$1 stamp covered the charge for a lost or destroyed certificate. Their use was discontinued January 31, 1964, when the post office stopped processing the forms.




RVB1 - The \$1 stamp is plentiful in mint condition cataloging \$37.50 for this complete MNH piece. Used is another matter as a used top stamp catalogs \$750! Very few of these stamps were used on lost or destroyed certificates.



First Day of Use - April 1, 1960 - Rockland, Mass. At right is the reverse showing the temporary certificate.



RVB2 - The \$3 stamp is plentiful in mint condition cataloging \$45.00 for this complete MNH piece. Since this was the predominant use, used stamps are much more reasonable at \$30.00.

Aug 4, 1913. Parcel Post stamps were Authorized for regular mail Starting July 1.



Oct 27, 1922 Plattsburg, NY to Norfolk, VA

Both stamps showing USPOD employees!

Mail carrier on the 2¢ Parcel Post used to pay regular postage and Bicycle messenger on the Special Delivery stamp.

Very nice combo!

Postcard to Paul Miller at the Atlantic Hotel in Norfolk, VA. Special Delivery to the hotel, Fee Claimed marking.

Mr Miller left a forwarding address to La Harve. France, but no forwarding postage!

Sent postage due 30 centimes for the 2¢ UPU postcard rate to France. Nice 30c French postage due tied by La Harve postmark.


