



The History of Hockey

49¢ Forever Souvenir Sheet of Two PSA Panes of 20 October 20—Detroit, MI

The National Hockey Association began play in 1910 and evolved into the National Hockey League in 1917. Seven of the 31 NHL teams are based in Canada, with the rest in the US.



With this souvenir sheet, the U.S. Postal Service and Canada Post join in celebrating ice hockey, the fast-paced sport played on frozen ponds and in rinks across North America. The sheet features a scene that illustrates the evolution of the sport across generations. The scene also includes one of the issuance's two se-tenant stamps, which portrays a modern hockey player. The second stamp, which is positioned upside-down, or tete-beche, pictures a vintage player, who represents the game's past, set against a snowy background. One player is wearing a contemporary uniform and using modern equipment, and the other is wearing a vintage garb and using old-fashioned equipment.

The two vertically stacked stamps, which are arranged to mirror each other, are identical to those sold in panes of 20. "The History of Hockey" appears in the bottom left corner of the sheet under the flags of the United States and Canada.

Canada Post is issuing a souvenir sheet and a booklet of 10 stamps.

U.S. Postal Service to issue Alzheimer's semi-postal in November

The next semi-postal stamp from the USPS will raise funds to combat Alzheimer's disease. The Postal Service announced October 2nd that the new stamp will be issued in November, but no date or location was announced, and no preliminary stamp design was revealed.

The Alzheimer's stamp will be the first of five semi-postal stamps to be issued over a 10-year period, with each stamp to be sold for no more than two years. A Post Traumatic Stress Disorder stamp will be issued in 2019 with the other three subjects yet to be determined.

The five semi-postal stamps are being planned in accordance with the Semi-Postal Authorization Act (Public Law 106-253), which grants the USPS discretionary authority to issue and sell semi-postal stamps to advance such causes as it considers to be "in the national public interest and appropriate."

Alzheimer's Awareness was the subject of a 42¢ stamp issued October 17, 2008 (Scott 4358). Though it addressed the subject of Alzheimer's as part of the USPS social awareness stamp program, the 2008 stamp did not raise funds to fight the disease, as the new stamp will.

U.S. Special Delivery Stamps - Part One By Tim Wait

Special Delivery service started October 1, 1885. The service was initially limited to cities with a population of 4,000 or more, which resulted in 555 post offices being serviced at the start. Beginning October 1, 1886, Special Delivery service was available at all post offices.

A 10¢ Special Delivery stamp, up until 1944, secured later delivery during daytime and evening hours at most post offices. Post Offices employed "messenger boys" who were paid 8¢ of the 10¢ fee to rush the letter to its recipient.

When the service began in 1885 the only means of transportation was to run the letter to the addressee. Most letters were to businesses which were usually located in the center business district of the community, near the main post office. Two stamps with different inscriptions were issued in 1885 and 1886.

In 1902 when a new series of definitive stamps was issued, a new special delivery stamp featuring a "bicycle messenger" was issued. In 1908 a new design showing the "Helmut of Mercury", the messenger god, was issued. This issue was quickly nicknamed the "Merry Widow" stamp after a popular play at the time and received much negative press. It was also smaller and green so not as noticeable as the larger blue stamps that had been used. Shortly thereafter in 1909 the "bicycle messenger" was put back to press and it was quietly retired from use.

day and night, to people who have letters to mail . . . and no stamps. It is a coinoperated U. S. mail box and postage meter.

To mail a letter you (1) drop coins in a slot (2) dial your postage value (3) insert your letter . . . and away it goes, stamped, postmarked and automatically deposited for collection. No adhesive stamps . . . no stamp-licking . . . no premium for postage.

This "self-service post office" prints U. S. meter stamps in denominations up to 52¢ on letters of various kinds and sizes, including Air Mail, Special Delivery and foreign mail. It can handle as many as 72 letters a minute,

The "Mailonat" was developed by Pitney-Bowes Postage Meter Co., Stamford, Conn., in cooperation with the U. S. Post Office Department, to provide the public with stamp-buying and mailing facilities at times and places where they are not now available . . . in post office lobbies, hotels, stores, railway terminals and other public places.

The "MAILOMAT" Coin-Operated Letter Box was the first automated mailing machine installed by the United State Post Office Department in the late 1940's. You just put in the correct coins, dial in the postage you need and insert your letter. The machine automatically put "postage" in the form of a printed Pitney-Bowes meter.

The machines were available when the Post Office wasn't open and could also be placed in hotels, store, railway terminals and other public places.

This was an experiment that has morphed over the last 70 years to the Automated Postage Center (APC) machine found in most post offices today.

Chicagopex 2017

The largest annual show in Illinois and throughout the Mid-west, will be held Friday, November 17th to Sunday, November 19th. The show hosts over 75 stamp dealers and 266 frames of exhibits. Chicagopex is also one of just two venues for a Philatelic Literature competition with about 30 entries. This dwarfs our Rockford 2-3-4 Stamp Expo that has 14 dealers and 30 exhibit frames!

Two national societies, the Society of Israel Philatelists and the British Caribbean Philatelic Study Group are holding their annual conventions at the show.

This year also features THREE separate book signing and presentations.

Nov. 17th 1pm "The Pictorial History of Walt Disney's First Superstar: Mickey Mouse, Volume One" by Edward Bergen. Nov. 18th 2pm "US Contract Mail Routes by Railroad (1832-1875)" by Hugh V. Feldman. Nov. 19 11am "Holocaust Postal History" by Justin Gordon.

This year's show theme is "Celebrating the 525th Anniversary of Columbus' Sailing". Special souvenir show cachets and cancellations will be available for all three days of the show. There will also be an exhibit of material from the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition with material from the extensive collection of our own Lyman Hensley. This is a must see exhibit that will enhance your experience at the show.

I recommend you make every attempt to attend and enjoy all this great show has to offer.

50th Anniversary of Statehood Issue

With Illinois Bicentennial coming up next year I was researching all the "Statehood" stamps issued by the USPOD and USPS over the years. Usually they celebrate the 50th, 100th, 150th and 200th anniversary of a states admittance to the United States.

Scott 858, issued Nov. 2, 1939 celebrated not one but four new states. North and South Dakota, Montana and Washington. This stamp is also referred to as the "clothesline" issue due to the look of the stamp. These states got ripped off in my opinion!
