

# 2019 New Issues - Aug/Sep

#### Tyrannosaurus rex

1st Class Forever Rate Pane of 16 Sep 29—Washington, DC

The Postal Service brings Tyrannosaurus rex to life some 66 million years after its demise. One design illustrates a face-to-face encounter with a T.rex approaching through a forest clearing; another shows the same young adult T.rex with a young Triceratops, both dinosaurs shown in fossil form. The third and fourth stamps depict a newly hatched T.rex covered with downy feathers and a bare-skinned juvenile T.rex chasing a primitive mammal. Described as "the Nation's T.rex," the young adult depicted on two of the stamps, was discovered on federal land in Montana and is one of the most studied and important specimens ever found. Its remains will soon be on display at the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of Natural History in Washington, D.C. Art director Greg Breeding designed the stamps with original artwork by Julius T. Csotonyi, a scientist and paleoartist.



The USPS is doing more to bring the Tyrannosaurus rex back to life! A lenticular component has been added to simulate motion in the stamp illustration. The effect will be similar to that seen on the Rabbit and Hat stamp on the 2018 Art of Magic souvenir sheet o three.

T.rex was the largest terrestrial carnivore of all time. It stood approximately 15 feet high and was about 40 feet in length, roughly six tons in weight. In its large mouth were six-inch long, sharp, serrated teeth.

#### Walt Whitman

3 Ounce Rate (85¢) Literary Arts Series Pane of 20 Sep 12—Huntington Station, NY



Walt Whitman is the 32nd honoree in the Literary Arts series, on the bicentennial of his birth. The stamp features a portrait of Whitman based on a photograph taken by Frank Pearsall in 1869. In the background, a hermit thrush sitting on the branch of a lilac bush recalls "When Lilacs Last in the Door-yard Bloom'd," an elegy for President Abraham Lincoln written by Whitman soon after Lincoln's assassination on April 14, 1865. Considered by many to be the father of modern American poetry, Whitman broke away from dominant European poetic forms and experimented with free verse and colloquial expressions, writing powerfully about nearly every aspect of 19th-century America. The artist for the stamp was Sam Weber. Art director Greg Breeding designed the stamp. The words "THREE OUNCE" on this stamp indicate its usage value. Like a First Class Forever stamp, this stamp will always be valid for the rate printed on it.

# Winter Berries

1st Class Forever Rate Booklet of 20 Sep 17—Tulsa, OK

Winter Berries, in a booklet of 20 stamps, celebrates four of winter's small yet vibrant offerings: the winterberry (*Ilex verticillata*), the juniper berry (*Juniperus communis*), the beautyberry (*Callicarpa americana*) and the soapberry (*Sapindus saponaria*). The stamp art features highly detailed botanical portraits of each plant that highlight the bold colors and rich textures of their berries. Artist Steve Buchanan worked with art director Antonio Alcalá to create these four new stamps.



### Rockford Main Post Office—Apollo 11 Postmark Update - Tim Wait

It was reported earlier that the Main Post Office on Harrison Avenue was not servicing FDC requests for our Rockford Stamp Club Postmark. A collector that wrote us for one of our FDCs tried to get his own postmarked at Rockford and his letter was returned with a hand written note "We are not participating this year!" I personally called the PO and asked and they said they would honor such requests.


Recently, another collector, who is in the process of documenting all the post-marks and FDCs for the issue and writing a book, contacted me and bought our four remaining show covers. He asked about the PO and I related what happened and that I thought they might honor his request.

As can be seen on the cover below, not only did they NOT honor his request, they have made up stickers to inform the requestor why it is being send back! I wonder how many requests they refused? At least now they are sorry!





# **Rockford Stamp Club Archives by Tim Wait**



I have been working on a First Day Cover exhibit of the Illinois Sesquicentennial stamp of 1968, Scott #1339. Recently, Hank found some material related to the cachet in the archives.

This letter, dated February 29, 1968 is from Bob Jones, Linn's Stamp News Assistant Editor.

It starts: "A short time ago someone in your club sent two or three mint envelopes with your cachets, and I "liberated" them and made some first day covers of the Ill. Stamp... the pioneer-hippie contrast was too good to miss, so the below cover resulted. Originally worded "enclosed" so apparently he thought about sending it o us but changed his mind!

Back in those days Linn's was a large size newspaper with 64 pages or more and had lots of room for promoting club show cachets and was popular to sell through an ad in Linn's!

The cachet was designed by Rockford resident Tom Wojahn who was a cartoonist for Hot Rod Magazine in the 1960's.

The show financial report shows a purchase of 2,000 cachets @ \$26.04!! Those were the days. We sold them for  $25 \not\in$  each of 5 for \$1.00.

Back to my collecting, just last week I acquired the FDC at left on eBay, with Bob Jones mark!


It is another of the two or three covers that Bob "liberated" and mailed in for servicing. In 1969, as it had been since the 1930's, if you wanted a cover postmarked you had to get it to the issuing post office BEFORE the first day ceremony. USPOD employees would add the stamp and cancel it using the handstamp prepared specifically for the event. If you were a "registered" FDC servicer you could send them in after the first day for an indeterminate time and they would receive a machine cancel.

Note the Bob Jones / 211½ S. Ohio Ave. / Sidney, Ohio rubber stamping on the back flap!
