

Inhibitory, Contaminated, and Rejected Milk Policy

- A. If any inhibitory or antibiotic substance is found in a producer sample, both New York and Pennsylvania require producer penalties.

- B. If an economic loss (Rejected Milk) is incurred by the Cooperative as a result of Adulteration, Antibiotics, Inhibitors, or high Bacteria, the following applies:
- a. Penalties for exclusion as outlined above, plus the value of all milk on that load.
 - b. Producer will be required to purchase and use a Delvo Test Kit on all treated animals, if the loss stems from an inhibitory substance found in the milk, before returning any of the milk to the supply.
 - c. A third offense within six months will result in a loss of market.
- C. New York state producers, in lieu of the above exclusion provisions, a fine may be levied upon the dairy farmer in an amount equivalent to the value of milk produced during such otherwise exclusionary period.
- D. All rejected milk shall be disposed of with the aid of Middlebury Co-op, and the producer responsible for the contamination shall reimburse Middlebury Co-op for the value of the milk either through farm liability insurance, cash, or milk check deduction approved by the appropriate state department.
