Your co-op is still run by a board of directors that is made up of dairy farmers who are dealing with the same issues you are. We are doing our best to represent Middlebury Co-op in a way that will be beneficial to every member.

Middlebury Co-op is as strong as its members. We will continue to pay back all monies received after costs are deducted. 2021 will have challenges. We are a resilient group of people, who are still blessed to live in a free country. Quality will continue to be paramount, which is something we have control over. We at Middlebury are endeavoring to do the best job we can to market your milk. Thank you for your continued support of your co-op.
