Did you know?

Middlebury Cooperative dates back to 1937. The original incorporation of Middlebury Cooperative took place on October 16, 1937 & was started by a small group of farmers in Middlebury Center, Pa. They later joined NEDCO, which disintegrated in 1985. It was then that Don Gilman & Denny Graves decided to re-incorporate Middlebury Co-op as its own entity & had it up and running by the end of 1986. We have been going strong as our own co-op ever since.



MIDDLEBURY CO-OP PRODUCTION IS ON THE RISE WITH SPRING IN THE AIR

In January we produced 12,685,072 lbs, in February we produced 11,637,072 lbs, and in March we produced 13,143,036 lbs. The average components, which had been seeing a steady increase through the end of 2020, are starting to level out. January butterfat: 4.08%, protein: 3.22%, other solids: 5.74%. February butterfat: 4.08%, protein: 3.21%, other solids: 5.77%. March butterfat: 4.04%, protein: 3.18%, other solids: 5.74%.
