#### THE RIVER IS COMING!!



Psalm 46:1-3 declares, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore will not we fear...though the waters thereof roar and be troubled..."

Little did we realize that normal Saturday morning, June 18th, how we would test this promise.

It came quickly. At 11:00am we heard shouting, "The river is coming!" Though we have seen this phenomenon before and had a little water in buildings, never had it come so fast. Soon it was rising inside the lowest school building. Staff and a few students worked to elevate books and electronics, never guessing it would reach 45 inches deep!

Flood waters rising quickly

The water continued to rise until 5:30 that evening. Three of

the five houses on the compound, the two school buildings, and even the school canteen and store had water inside. Most of the farm animals survived, but all pigs contracted a virus spread by the water and died several days later.

Behind the Living Hope compound, an invalid sat on her bed as the waters rose in her room. She called for help, but no one else in the apartment complex heard her before they left. Her bed started floating. Using her cell phone, she contacted a relative who came to her rescue. He and a friend tied a rope to the Living Hope school building pillar, waded through the rushing water to her apartment, and carried her piggyback to safety.

In the Abbina village next to the Living Hope compound, three houses collapsed and many had water damage. Eighteen of the 38 school staff suffered flood losses. In a village farther away, half of the houses were destroyed. Three bridges were taken out. One police officer lost his life.



Precipitation had been abundant this rainy season; however, that June morning it was not raining. Why then the flooding? The Living Hope compound is in the flood plain of five small rivers that converge into one and enter the sea. Widespread heavy rains in the north caused these rivers to swell, plus a dam was opened, turning the normal run-off into unprecedented high water.



Though the waters "roared", and we left the compound that night feeling like refugees, we experienced God's strength in so many ways. Fellow missionaries came immediately the next day to help with the clean-up and provide meals. Working diligently for four days, the teachers restored order in the school. The financial aid provided "a very present help in trouble" for replacing beds, furniture, appliances, and schoolbooks. The flood waters left the buildings damp, paint peeling, and mold growing, so restoration continues bit by bit.

After receiving aid, Justina, the school cook, expressed, "We are grateful! It wasn't easy at all, but my children were able to replace their school things that got spoiled. God richly bless you for helping us."






