# A little history...

"In 1992, an attempt was made to incorporate Birch Bay; however, it was defeated by the voters. In 2008, the county completed an incorporation feasibility study for the Birch Bay UGA which identified the issues with and benefits of incorporating. It concluded that Birch Bay incorporation was financially feasible given the community's tax base and service needs. The community has not made another attempt to incorporate as of 2015."





#### Birch Bay is already an Urban Growth Area


RCW 36.70A.110 Comprehensive plans — Urban growth areas.

- (1) Each county that is required or chooses to plan under RCW 36.70A.040 shall designate an urban growth area or areas within which urban growth shall be encouraged and outside of which growth can occur only if it is not urban in nature...
- (4) In general, cities are the units of local government most appropriate to provide urban governmental services.


Birch Bay is unique in that it is a standalone UGA, not centered around a city





The number of fulltime residents is trending upward while Canadian ownership is down to below 20%...





"Out of 966 children under 5 in Blaine and Birch Bay, 25 percent live in Blaine, while the other **75 percent reside in Birch Bay.** 

Additionally, 3,132 residents in Blaine and Birch Bay are under 18. **Nearly 60 percent reside in Birch Bay**, and the other 41 percent in Blaine, according to the 2020 U.S. Census data."

Birch Bay has always had rentals, but Airbnb changed everything in 2008... Given these transformations, it's wise to reconsider the question:


Is establishing Birch Bay as an incorporated city in our best interest?




## Taxes according to the 2008 Feasibility Study

- "Does the Contemplated Incorporation of Birch Bay Appear Financially Feasible?
  Yes. If Birch Bay residents pay the same level of taxes they would pay as part of
  unincorporated Whatcom County, a City of Birch Bay would generate enough
  revenues to provide a slightly higher level of service than Birch Bay residents
  currently receive." (Page ES-2)
- "When one thinks about running a city, there are any number of costs that are to some extent fixed (i.e. costs that tend to change little with modest changes in city size)... Given these built-in economies of scale, all else being equal, a larger city will find it easier to make ends meet than a smaller city." (Page ES-5)
- "So...if we vote to incorporate, will taxes go up with incorporation, or will they go down? The answer is: every city is different, and every city makes its own decisions." (Page ES-8)

## City of Birch Bay – Revenue and Expense Projections

#### Two approaches:

- Comparative Approach Look at similarly sized cities in Washington with comparable incomes/property values
- Extrapolation 2008 Birch Bay Incorporation study assumptions and actual growth in Whatcom County revenues and expenses between 2009 and 2023.

#### Limitations of data:

- Each City is unique and makes different decisions about what services to provide to its citizens.
- Different expenses and revenues change at varying rates

#### Use of data:


• If Birch Bay incorporated today, it would likely generate more revenue than needed to cover expenses.

### Regarding timeline...


- There is a clear and well document process for incorporation


## 3. Ratify Bylaws

## Priorities of Birch Bay Incorporation Association per the proposed Bylaws

- Transparency: All meetings open to the public taking input from all stakeholders
- Inclusivity: Giving representation to all members of our community, not just those that may eventually vote
- Legitimacy: Conduct ourselves in a manner that demonstrates we can self govern
- Critical & Analytical: Explore and accurately substantiate both the potential advantages and disadvantages of incorporation with authoritative data

#### **Proposed changes to Section 2 - Statement of Purpose**


- A. The purpose of BBIA is to advance a nonpartisan campaign explore and, if found feasible, advocate for incorporation to give residents of Birch Bay direct control over the future of our community. We BBIA will accomplish this purpose by:
  - 1. Creating an inclusive, nonpartisan process to plan for a explore the creation, through incorporation, of a future City of Birch Bay, including, but not limited to exploring and proposing city boundaries, form of government and classification of city.
  - 2. Promoting incorporation through community engagement a feasibility study and community engagement, soliciting feedback, and information sharing regarding the possibility of incorporating Birch Bay into a city.
  - 3. Serving as a liaison with County, State, and Boundary Review Board <u>and, should a feasibility</u> <u>study and sense of Birch Bay residents be positive</u>, to <u>advocate for and</u> advance the incorporation process through <u>a</u> citizen initiative.
- B. BBIA will not plan for, discern, or take positions on matters of future City policy including land use, health and safety regulations, and taxes.


# 4. Ratify Preliminary Boundaries

To determine Steering Committee eligibility and scope of work for initial feasibility study.



## Rationale for proposed preliminary boundaries

- Consistent with Urban Growth Area boundaries
  - Includes only areas currently designated for urban growth, no rural areas
- Consistent with Comprehensive Plan policies
- Consistent with 2008 Feasibility Study boundaries
- Serviced by Birch Bay Water & Sewer
- Excludes areas where polling indicated less desire for incorporation
