■ Diagonal Duo Tote Bag – Free Sewing Tutorial

(Beginner Friendly - Makes 1 or 2 Bags)

≍ Finished Size: 16" high × 18" wide (landscape) with flat boxed corners

Materials Needed (for 2 bags)

Fabric A (blue/top fabric) – 1 yard (44" wide)

Fabric B (multicolor/bottom fabric) – 1 yard (44" wide)

Lining fabric - 1 yard

Heavy fusible interfacing – 1 yard

Matching thread

Sewing machine, rotary cutter/scissors, ruler, pins/clips, iron

■ If you only want 1 bag, you'll still need 1 yard of each fabric, but you'll have leftover halves for another bag.

Cutting Instructions

- 1. Cut 2 rectangles ($18'' \times 16''$) from Fabric A.
- 2. Cut 2 rectangles (18" x 16") from Fabric B.
- 3. Stack fabrics in this exact order, all RIGHT SIDES UP:
 - Fabric A (blue) rectangle 1
 - Fabric B (multicolor) rectangle 1
 - Fabric A (blue) rectangle 2
 - Fabric B (multicolor) rectangle 2
- Keeping all right sides up prevents mismatched panels.
- 4. On the top rectangle, measure 3" down from the top right corner.
 - 5. Draw a line from this mark to the bottom left corner.

- 6. Cut through all 4 layers at once. You'll have 8 pieces total (4 tops + 4 bottoms).
- 7. Swap fabrics: Bag 1 = Fabric A top + Fabric B bottom. Bag 2 = Fabric B top + Fabric A bottom.

Sewing Instructions

- Step 1: Outer Panels Fuse interfacing. Sew top + bottom pieces together along diagonal seam. Press open and topstitch.
 - Step 2: Straps Fuse interfacing. Fold long edges in, fold again, topstitch both sides.
 - Step 3: Outer Bag Assembly Place panels right sides together, sew sides + bottom.
 - Cut a 3" x 3" square from each bottom corner.
 - Open the cut, match seams, sew across to box corners.
- Step 4: Lining Sew lining panels, leaving a 4–5" opening at bottom. Box corners the same way.
 - Step 5: Attach Straps Pin straps 4" in from each side seam, baste.
- Step 6: Join Outer & Lining Place outer bag inside lining, right sides together. Sew around top. Turn through lining opening.
 - Step 7: Finish Close lining opening, push lining inside, press top edge, and topstitch.
 - Result: You now have a bold, sturdy Diagonal Duo Tote with a 3" offset diagonal seam and flat boxed base. Using all 4 rectangles makes 2 bags!

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
