

It's Been 10 years of dedication and hard work. Hoping for at least another 10 years.



As we enter another month of 2025, we thought we would share a little history of our organization. During the next couple of months, we will focus on FOCCAS, its people, and its programs. Many of us are new to the area and know just a little about FOCCAS, but maybe not the whole story. Let's first take a look at our beginnings.

Focus on Cumberland County Animal Safety (FOCCAS) began in 2015 as Focus on Cumberland Country Animal Shelter gaining our 501(c)3 status 12 months later. Our vision

was and is to create a kind, compassionate, responsible culture of animal welfare in our community. The original mission was to increase awareness of the needs of the county-run animal shelter and the plight of the animals there.



A capital campaign was launched in October 2016 to build a new intake/holding facility. Site preparation began in January 2018. The \$380,000 building was completed in 2019 and gifted by FOCCAS to the community. With the facility's completion in 2019, we changed our name and mission statement to include more community programs to address the suffering and neglect we see in our county.

As FOCCAS has grown, so has our vision for our community's homeless, abandoned, and lost pets. We have joined a network of local and regional rescues and animal welfare groups. Each fills a need in a community, and by working together, we have found resources for many injured, homeless, and abandoned animals that had no previous advocate.



Our program takes in dumped and surrendered cats, dogs, and puppies from Cumberland and surrounding counties. Our team traps, transports, shelters, socializes, and provides medical intervention and daily care. When possible, the animal is fostered in a home environment, fully vetted, and placed for adoption on Petfinder and AdoptAPet. Our busy adoption team and volunteers spend countless hours finding fosters, forever homes, and alternative placements for these precious cats and amazing dogs. In 2023, over 19 cats and 227 dogs were placed in new forever homes. We frequently rescue "unadoptable" pets, such as hospice dogs and unsocialized dogs. These dogs remain in foster care until the end of their lives.

Next month, we will examine some of our special programs. This work and our special programs are only possible due to our dedicated volunteers and donors.

Rescues of the Month

A wonderful sponsor is willing to cover the adoption costs of **two dogs per month**. The sponsor wants to focus on dogs that have been in the rescue for the longest time, older dogs, or hard-to-adopt dogs. The sponsor strongly feels that letting people know the adoption cost is covered will improve the dogs' chances of being adopted. Thus, **Featured Rescues of the Month** was born.

We Need Your Help So We Can Help Levi

Levi's remarkable journey began in the fall of 2021 when he was hit by a car and left for dead. Despite suffering severe injuries, including a brachial plexus (a network of nerves located in the neck and shoulder area that controls movement and sensation in the upper limbs) injury, multiple mandibular (jawbone)fractures, and several fractured bones in his right front leg,

Levi's resilience and determination have inspired us all. After undergoing multiple surgeries, including the amputation of his leg and a temporary tracheotomy, Levi has continued to thrive.



However, his journey is far from over. Levi recently developed a cyst on the side of his face, which was caused by an abscessed tooth root. Despite treatment with antibiotics, the cyst has returned, and Levi requires further surgery.

We are committed to providing Levi with the best possible care. We are reaching out to our supporters for help. Levi's upcoming surgery is estimated to cost between \$5,700 and \$7,100. We have a donor willing to match the 1st \$500 in donations. We are grateful for any donation, big or small, to help us cover the costs of Levi's care.
