

Kids in the foster home will get a chance to learn about different dog breeds, show empathy, practice responsibility and even play outside more. And after living together


for a while, the foster family can provide an accurate and insightful description of the dog or cat, which helps them find a better long-term match.


Happy Tails – It's a Family Affair
