I foster because I have been privileged to share my life with many dogs, who cheered me through life's inevitable ups and downs. Dogs are work, but they give so much back in return for their care. For me the best thing about fostering is knowing that I have been able to help other families find an ideal chosen family member. We don't necessarily get to pick out our human families. But they are willing to commit to ten or more years of these dogs in their lives, so I want it to be the best experience possible for all the humans and the dog. I get a lot of satisfaction out of my contact with these families. Most people I meet at events say they "could never foster" as they would get too attached and not be able to give the dog away. But our family dog, Rocket, has been able to help me calm fosters, teach fosters how to walk on a leash well, and greet visitors respectfully, and it has certainly been a team effort. He teaches dogs in a different way than I can as a human; it's amazing to see some of our experiences mirrored on the "Dog Whisperer," as Jeanne has shared in a prior newsletter. I know that if I keep an adoptable dog, then both Rocket and I will have much less



time, energy, and ability to foster future dogs. And I will have closed off that potential adoptee from being the Number One Dog in another family's life. I guess perhaps if I keep an adoptee for over a year, then I would reconsider, especially as the one I have now, Petty, is almost eight. It would be hard ON HIM to ask him to adapt to an additional family should he get entirely comfortable and settled into our family routine, including vacations, etc. I think it would be easier for a younger dog to move out after a year in foster care. But so far, I have been blessed in not having any of my fosters for more than four months.


