"Every Memorial Day weekend for the past nine years, the Airmasters RC Club has sponsored the I.O.K Dawn Patrol Rendezvous in North Bend, Ohio. The field is nestled on the north side of the Ohio River, next to the Indiana border and is 18 miles west of downtown Cincinnati. The event leads off the summer for several World War I enthusiasts from Indiana, Ohio, and Kentucky (I.O.K), however, visitors from as far away as Wisconsin, Michigan, and Tennessee have been known to attend.

"Dawn Patrol faithful are used to the calm wind of the Ohio River early mornings and late evenings, but this year the flying weather was nearly perfect all day for both official days of the event. There was a late-day, pop-up storm on Saturday, but all who wanted to fly in the official two-day event had an opportunity.

"Aircraft built at 1/3 scale are common at these types of events, but more 1/2-scale models are being built and flown as the newer engines and stronger servos become more commonplace. Trailers and toy haulers are now the means for transportation, with many utilizing on-site camping throughout the day and evening."
