



A special highlight was a meal delivered by the NPP's (non physician providers – PAs, Nurse Practitioners) from Avera Medical Associates Clinic. The days get long for guests who are doing radiation – their appointments take 15 minutes or less a day and that leaves a lot of down time so the arrival of a meal, complete with smiling faces and a baby was a welcome respite!

Thank you to everyone who has helped stock the kitchen – we are happy to report that there has been some very tasty stew, soup and desserts prepared in what will always be Sr. Sandra's kitchen.

Join us for a discussion on end of life decisions

If you had a life threatening illness, would your family be able to make health care decisions for you? Would they know what you want to have done, or more importantly, what you do not want at end of life?

Bringing up the topic of decision making at end of life is never popular – in fact it can bring a conversation to a screeching halt. However, think of the advantages of starting this discussion when you are healthy and not in crisis mode. Obtaining information, considering your options and talking with your family is best done at the kitchen table – not at the bedside.

Starting this discussion early helps you obtain the information needed to make good decisions, it also allows time for family discussion – as uncomfortable as it is – and communicates to your loved ones what is most important to you. Advance directives for healthcare is a gift for your family.

Driver Rehabilitation program

Possibly the most difficult conversation that families have is when someone is no longer safe to drive. Our daily lives are often centered on driving. Our vehicles get us to our job, church, coffee groups and the grocery store. Even if family members identify a driving concern they are often reluctant to bring up the subject for fear of offending or upsetting the family member. It is easy to rationalize that since we live in a small community, and often the driver has a set route, it is safe to continue the use of a car. But what happens if there is road construction and the usual route is disrupted? Or how will they feel if there is an accident and someone is injured?

Avera Therapy is providing driving assessments to help identify barriers to safe driving including: adaptive equipment needed, eye-foot-hand reaction time, memory/cognitive skills needed for driving, physical factors that affect driving, safety and judgement and understanding traffic signs/roads rules.


What are some signs that a driving assessment is needed?

- Damage to the vehicle (often unreported)
- Traffic tickets or warnings
- Experiencing road rage
- Getting lost
- Anxiety about getting to routine places
- Not paying attention to other vehicles
- Difficulty/failure to check rear view mirror
- Difficulty moving foot from gas to brake
- Difficulty concentrating

The assessment is a two part evaluation which is done in the clinic and behind the wheel. After the evaluation you will receive feedback and possible recommendations.
