I've lost many wishes through the years thanks to a quick glance in a rearview mirror, one last look at the towering bales surely guaranteed that my wish for a new car, a million dollars or a pony was gone forever.

I would guess that many of us have made wishes over the past 2 years – mostly the wish for our friends and family to stay healthy, to burn our masks and travel with comfort. Perhaps, above all else, the wish to return to "normal".

Normal is defined as conforming to a standard; something that is usual, typical, or expected.

Normal is our safe space and now we must develop a new sense of norm, making plans for the future, appreciating today but also aware that life can change on a dime.

Every day when the phone rings in our office we know it may be someone whose norm has been shattered with a potentially life changing diagnosis of cancer or dementia.

Even if they sound calm and in control, illness has turned their world upside down. The future is unknown and unsettling.

Fortunately, through the years you have sent us a strong message:

Do whatever you can to help – provide funds for gas, food and motels.

Open the doors of St Benedict's Guest House and provide a clean bed, we will fill the freezer with homemade food.

Provide support for Avera@Home Hospice – hospice should always be part of the mission.

Provide memory screenings for patients and resource information and support for their families.

Don't charge for anything that is done, we will help.

Calm the frayed edges of their chaotic world. Let them know that their community cares about their journey and wants to help.

Give them hope.

Who benefits?

People with Parkinson's disease and other neurological disorders

What is the goal?

To increase limb and body movement to improve flexibility, walking speed and mechanics, freezing, reaction time, balance, coordination, and fatigue.

The exercises improve the ability to do everyday activities such as buttoning a shirt, standing up or opening a jar. It helps you move faster, easier, more efficiently and have more confidence in how you move.

Who provides the training?

Specially trained physical therapists

How often would I attend?

1 hour a day for 4 days a week for 4 weeks

When should I start?

NOW! This program is designed for any stage of Parkinson's

How do I get started?

Ask your physician for a PT (Physical Therapy) evaluation order for the Parkinson's program

Is this program covered under insurance and Medicare?

In most cases yes – as with any program always check your reimbursement sources before you begin. Avera Therapy services may be able to answer your questions also.

* LSVT stands for Lee Silverman Voice Treatment. LSVT BIG was designed to address movement deficiencies in those that suffer from Parkinson's disease.
