

# 79<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention Joint with South and North Wisconsin – Upper Michigan Districts October 12, 2024

The convention got underway Saturday morning with registration and fellowship at 8:00 a.m...

A Communion Worship Service began at 8:30 a.m. at Trinity Lutheran Church in Wausau. Rev. Ryan Fehrmann from Aniwa served as officiant and liturgist and Rev. Preston Paul, NWD LLL Counselor, delivered the sermon. The convention offering was taken during the worship service. The convention offering will be split three ways South Wisconsin's LHM's International ministry office, the North Wisconsin's ministry office – Laos, and LHM and Lutheran Hour Ministries

NWD President, Neal Schalow called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. at Trinity Lutheran Church in Wausau. Neal Schalow welcomed everyone to the convention on behalf of the joint convention committee. Then Neal introduced our special guests — NWD LCMS Vice President Bill Jordon, NWD LWML President, Joan Berquist, SWD LWML Vice-President — Marilyn Belter, SWD LLL President - Tom Beineke, Keynote Speaker, Dr. Kari Vo — Lutheran Hour Ministries, Theological Editor and author of LHM Daily Devotions, Dick and Lynn Gast, Lutheran Hour Ministries Float Committee, and Cathy Robinson, WI Division of Orphan Grain Train.

Announcements: Neal Schalow announced that there are displays for your review outside the chapel from the LHM Float Committee (Pedal Pushers), and an LHM resources table. Make sure you visit the displays. Neal thanked Cindy Schalow for her work on the convention booklet, Joe Seigel for making the name tags, and Sherrilee Wallerman for handling the convention registration. #### **NWD LCMS Vice President**

#### **NWD LWML President**

NWD LWML President Joan Berquist addressed the convention.

- A great start to the 2024-2026 biennium here in the LWML of the North Wisconsin District (NWD). At our convention in June, we voted to support a Mission Grant Goal \$120,000 for this biennium with additional funding of grants in the amount of \$20,000 that has been received over time and held in our Gifts and Bequests Fund for a total \$140,000 funding of Mission Grants. At our meeting in September the board voted to pay \$41,000 of the 2024-2026 Mission Grants and paid the additional \$20,000 from Gifts and Bequests. The Mission Grants paid are listed below:
  - o Grant #1 NWD Professional Church workers Student Grants in the amount of \$15,000
  - o Grant #2 The Hannah Center, Inc \$10,000
  - o Grant #3 Trinity House Maternity Home, \$10,000
  - o Grant #4 God's Word for Teenagers Around the World \$8,000
  - o Grant #5 In Every Tongue: Translators for MOST Ministries Teams \$8,000
  - o Grant #6 Bringing Hope and Encouragement to Cancer Patients \$10,000
- The Short-Term Mission Trip to Michigan was amazing.
  - We visited Lutheran Heritage Foundation, LAMP Ministry, POBLO International, Camp Restore and MOST Ministries. We learned about each of the ministries, and we were able to participate in a servant event at each one.
- At Camp Restore, (reclamation of run down area of Detroit) they expressed a need for a used van for their mentoring program. About that same time, our district received a generous donation, and we were able to send them a check for \$10,000 to meet their need for a van.

#### **SWD LWML President**

SWD LWML Vice President – Marilyn Belter addressed the convention on behalf of SWD LWML President Cinda Poppe.

- LWML has given more than 100 million in mission grants
- 75% of Mites collected stay in our districts and 25% are sent in to support the National Mission goal
- 31 Mission Grants were selected at the 2023-2025 bi-annual convention
  - Two will help support the mission of LHM
    - Sharing Christ with Women and Children of Kazakhstan = \$100,000
    - Expanding Gospel Outreach in Hispanics in the U.S. \$100,000
- \$220,000 is the SWD LWML Goal

Joe Seigel, Joint Website Administrator, indicated that he will be working on a contact database. He asked us to encourage our churches to look and utilize the NWD/SWD Joint website. He encouraged us to send him photos and events to put on the website.

Paul Brietenfedlt encouraged us to read the booklet, "Come Back".

#### 1st Session

Neal Schalow presided over the 1<sup>st</sup> session. He introduced the keynote speaker, Dr. Kari Vo, from the Lutheran Hour Ministries. She presented on Learning to Live with God, "Bible, Prayer, and Action".

She writes about half of the Lutheran Hour Daily Devotions. It is difficult to get the Gospel into some countries, but it can be done through thumb drives and satellites etc.. When you share the Gospel we can connect globally, locally, and digitally.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Session

Neal Schalow introduced Cathy Robinson – WI Division Orphan Grain Train.

Cathy spoke on the mission statement of OGT – They encourage and enable God's people to share personal and material resources in bringing Christ's name and character to needy people both far and near.

#### What is OGT?

Orphan Grain Train is a Nonprofit Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. Grain Train volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. The Orphan Grain Train movement is a loving response to Jesus Christ's example as a servant and His love for us.

Just a few of the Wisconsin Division Projects

- Volunteers loaded 30,000 pounds of potatoes 30 pallets of 125 (8 lb.) bags headed for Ysleta Mission in El Paso.
- Vitaliy Smolin with Public Organization "Open door Foundation" in Ukraine has received 19,000 pounds of various canned foods, medical equipment & supplies, Bibles, & other needed aid.
- Wisconsin Branch & Minnesota North Collection Center together funded a shipment of 40,000 pounds of edible dried navy beans for Water for Life in Liberia.
- Volunteers loaded 11,880 Food for Kidz meals, 4,750 pounds of various foods and other aid for Latin American Lutheran Mission (LALM) in Laredo, TX.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Session

Tom Beineke introduced Dick and Lynn Gast, Lutheran Hour Ministries Float Committee, Chairmen.

About the Petal Pushers: More than 4,000 volunteers from across the United States and Canada come together to help build floats. The **Petal Pushers** work on a variety of floats, giving them an opportunity to work side-by-side with people from many different backgrounds, believers and non-believers alike.

74 years ago, 12 members of the Lutheran Laymen's League started the LHM Float Committee. Today the committee is made up of 36 members.

The LHM float is a self-funded project of the Lutheran Hour Ministries Float Committee and the Southern California District of the International Lutheran Laymen's League. The committee's ongoing work is funded primarily by generous donations from Christian friends and multiple fundraising activities and is not included in the operating budget of Lutheran Hour Ministries.

Petal Pusher merchandise helps fund the work of the float committee.

The Lutheran Hour Ministries float "Make a Joyful Noise unto the Lord" will be entered as the only Christian float in the parade to carry on its mission of providing a Gospel witness to viewers everywhere, from along the parade route to televisions worldwide.
