- Principal Updates (Chad Thomas)
  - End of Year parties:
    - Likely sometime the week of June 4<sup>th</sup> - 7<sup>th</sup>
      - Party dates are dependent on final testing schedule which the school will receive from CMS
    - Same format as last year
    - 8<sup>th</sup> grade party is usually the first date: likely June 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup>
      - At Bailey Park
      - T-shirts by home room, pizza, field games run by the staff, DJ by Mr. Aiello
    - 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> grade party

- Parent Topic: Student backpacks
  - Parents' concern: backpacks are too heavy
  - Bailey was one of the last schools to use lockers. The lockers consumed a lot of time. Only half or less than half of students actually used their locker. Bailey was using string bags to put some things in the locker at a time, but it was all going home so that wasn't working very well. Hough also doesn't use lockers.
  - Students should only be carrying only one notebook per class. (If they have more, then they are carrying old ones.) There are a few classes with exceptions (like Math 2)
  - Students often carry bulks supplies that they don't need. (Like carrying 30 pencils, or a ton of pens, colored pencils, etc.)
  - Students worry they will be given a signature for not having all of these items
  - Consider smaller, lighter water bottles (like don't carry huge Stanley water bottle). Consider lighter lunchbox options.
  - Parent ideas:
    - Could students leave their chargers at home if they have charged their chromebooks?
    - Could parents donate extra chargers to leave in the classrooms?
    - Could the school consider letting students leave their chromebooks in their homerooms (or lockers) overnight if they are not needed for homework or if they have another computer at home they use?
    - Better align the back-to-school supply lists with what students actually need so parents aren't buying (and students aren't carrying) extra supplies that aren't needed for a particular class.
