 - This will be the "spring fundraiser" (and PJ Fridays)
 - \$20 for tickets
 - Send a list of students who bought tickets on Wed. or Thurs. of that week to double check that students have a good behavior sheet
 - Need to have 2- 3 officers at the dance. (Give Sabrina officers' info so she can cut them a check)
 - Theme: Glow in the Dark. Casual. We will give them a glow item (like a necklace)
 - Will host a "Glow bar" to purchase glow items
 - Tickets will have a perforated tab to go to concessions
 - Students can get food at a food bar
 - 415 is the max capacity in the gym

- Need to finalize approach for driving ticket sales early:
 - Consider capping the participants...even if just decide to later extend the limit
 - Consider offering an incentive for buying tickets early.
 (Ex: additional glow item, or additional concession ticket)
- Expenses should be low. Decorations likely \$400 \$500
- Raffles...sell at 6th grade lunches. Will announce the winners at the dance. (Ex: glow basket, LuLu gift card, Dick's gift card)
- Request donations for snacks
- Mr. Aiello will likely be the DJ
- Consider leveraging Influencers: 30 per grade level, so 90 students who could help set up / decorate
- Make a flyer for the dance
- Sign-up Genius: need a target number of volunteers
